The festival provided an opportunity for officers to engage with families in a relaxed and informal setting, helping to build trust and strengthen relationships with communities they serve.

School visits

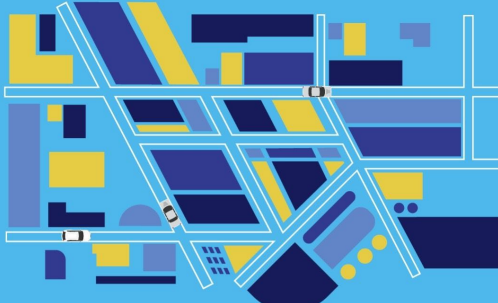
PCSO Meszes recently visited Millbrook Infant School to talk to pupils about the role of the police and how we help keep our communities safe.

ASB motorcycle nuisance

Neighbourhood officers have been supporting colleagues from Corby as part of Operation Tides; an initiative aimed at tackling the illegal use of e-scooters. During the operation, more than 80 e-scooters were seized. Following reports of anti-social behaviour involving off-road motorcycles in Desborough, officers carried out a dedicated week of action in the area. This resulted in three motorcycles being seized and one man being reported for a number of road traffic offences.
