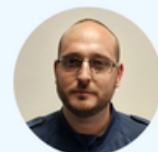

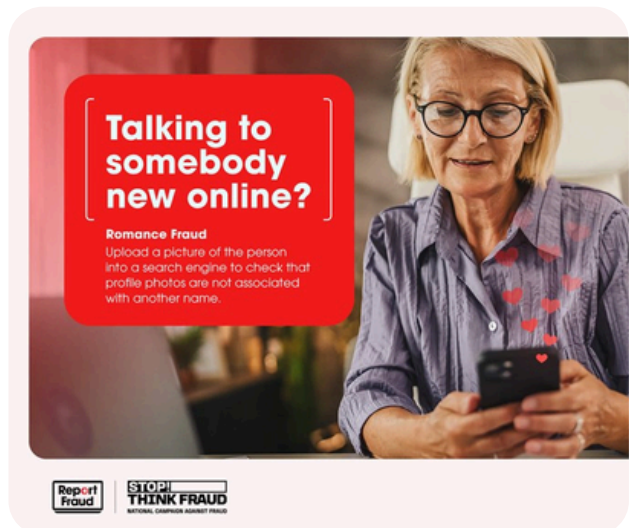

Updates



In April, the Northamptonshire Police Clear Hold Build team working with partners was presented with an award at the annual SOC Local conference. Clear Hold Build is a three-step plan that sees crime and anti-social behaviour, offenders and their associates cleared from an area through targeted investigative and enforcement activity. The area is then held and stabilised through high-visibility policing, support from partner agencies and community involvement. Read more [here](#).

In Northamptonshire, there has been 151 victims of romance fraud during the 12-month period, resulting in the loss of £1,092,936, which has prompted officers from the county’s Economic Crime Unit to support a national campaign to raise awareness of this type of fraud. Romance fraud typically involves sustained contact, with offenders carefully building trust and emotional attachment with the victim before creating a situation where the victim feels they should send money. Now in its seventh year, Operation Snap continues to reap the rewards of public support with nearly 3,000 dash-cam videos submitted to Northamptonshire Police in the past 12 months. Between April 2025 and April this year, the Force’s Safer Roads Team reviewed 2,899 videos submitted by more than 1,400 individual witnesses compared to 2,340 clips for the same 12-month period in 2024/25. Updates



An operation led by Northamptonshire Police’s Safer Roads Team and assisted by the National Police Air Service saw 140 e-scooters and e-bikes ridden by suspected criminals taken off the streets of Northampton. Operation Journey took place between March 14 and March 28 and saw five days of action in response to reports of crime perpetrated by people using e-scooters and e-bikes. It also responded to public complaints about these vehicles being ridden in an anti-social manner. Read more [here](#).

Twenty-three drivers were stopped by the Kettering Neighbourhood Policing Team in just one day after being caught speeding during a special day of action aimed at improving road safety across the town. The checks were carried out last month (April 17) across six locations in the Kettering area, which resulted in three drivers issued with a fixed penalty notice after exceeding the 30mph limits in Deeble Road and Polwell Lane (Burton Latimer). A new knife amnesty bin has been installed outside the Methodist Church on School Lane in Kettering town centre as part of ongoing efforts to tackle knife crime and support communities across Northamptonshire. The bin provides a safe and anonymous way for members of the public to dispose of knives and weapons. The installation forms part of Northamptonshire Police’s support for the national knife crime awareness campaign, which aims to reduce serious violence and encourage safer communities.
