News

We've had a few reports of distraction burglaries in your area over the last month. Offenders are pretending to be from the 'water company' – saying there's a leak or they need to check your supply – just to get inside your home. While one keeps you talking, another searches for valuables. Here's how to stay safe: Check their ID – and use the official number from the company's website, not the one they give you. Keep the door chain on when speaking to anyone you're not expecting. Don't feel pressured – real workers won't mind you



double-checking. Set up a password scheme with your utility provider for planned visits. If something feels off, close the door and call 999. The beat team are carrying out targeted patrols. These criminals often target older or more vulnerable residents, so please check in on relatives, friends and neighbours who might need extra support.


PCs 892 Dan, 1071 Callum and PCSO 6641 Calum teamed up with <u>Blaby District</u>, City of Wolverhampton Council, and the <u>Driver & Vehicle Standards Agency</u> for a multi-agency operation checking taxis for roadworthiness and driver compliance. Road safety has been highlighted as a priority by many of our residents on the beat. Partnership work like this is especially important over the festive period, when more people are out and about and relying on taxis to get home safely. It helps us tackle drivers who leave vehicles in unsafe conditions – putting passengers and other road users at risk. Here's what we found: 15 taxis inspected (all licensed by Wolverhampton City Council) 2 taxis taken off the road immediately by DVSA, 7 delayed prohibitions issued, 6 taxi plates removed, 4 taxis given advice on minor



defects and 3 vehicles had no issues at all. These checks make a real difference in keeping people safe. Thanks to all the agencies involved further operations will be held in the future.
