Bike marking events

In May, PCSOs across Towcester carried out bike marking in the area. Over three days, 35 bikes were marked and registered under the Bikeregister scheme.

Towcester patrols

Officers carried out high-visibility patrols at Screwfix in Towcester following an increased threat of armed robberies affecting similar stores across the county. By working closely with the store to develop a patrol plan and provide crime prevention advice, officers helped reduce the risk of the Towcester branch being targeted and increased staff confidence and feelings of safety in the workplace. Partnership crime prevention

In June, officers attended a partnership crime prevention event in Towcester attended by specialist Northamptonshire Police teams, organisations such as Towcester Age UK, and several other local charities.
