CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

1. At the time of writing (Friday, 19th June, 2026), the secure Neighbourhood Watch (NW) database recorded the following membership numbers in Staffordshire:

3952 registered NW members

262 coordinators

4 area coordinators (Stoke, Leek [*Staffordshire Moorlands*] South Staffordshire

5 Staffs Watch committee members

NO-ONE is paid in Staffordshire.

There is a small paid team based in **London**.

We liaise with a Staffordshire Police superintendent, who is our link with Neighbourhood Watch.

The Police Fire and Crime Commissioner Ben Adams supports us.

Our **overall aim** is to have one area coordinator, a police representative and a council officer in each of the 10 local/neighbourhood policing areas.

However, the state of affairs with NW in Staffordshire can best be summed up by the turnout at the last AGM in June 2025-**4 members** joined the 5 committee members!

2. During the last twelve months:

- a) 20 new schemes have been started in the **Penkridge** area, through the hard work of one of our area coordinators, working closely with a PCSO.
- b) Through the tireless efforts of the area coordinator in **Leek**, many people have joined NW, and incidents of ASB have reduced.
- c) A PCSO in the **Stoke south** area has started several NW schemes.
- d) We are working closely with Lichfield Council and the local police team to re-activate existing NW schemes (and start new ones) in that area.

3. Aims for the next twelve months

Funding-we desperately need funding to support the purchase of NW street signs, stickers and publicity materials in all 10 NPTs (**N**eighbourhood **P**olicing **T**eam areas).

Members-activate existing members who've gone quiet, or start new schemes and recruit new members.

We ask new members to join NW (it's free)-one person becomes a named coordinator, and informs their neighbours if something isn't right, or passes a police alert, and at the same time checks on neighbours.

Raise awareness:

With residents, local police and council.
