MARLOW RURAL CRIME 🐈


Marlow NHPT have been receiving reports of dogs worrying and attacking livestock.

Incidents have been across our policing area, with recent incidents in Hughenden and Marlow. Sadly, at Marlow Common, a ewe was killed and has now left two orphaned lambs. Not only is this a cost to the farmer, but the lambs need special milk at additional cost.

Neare take care in ensuring that dogs are kept on leads within our rural areas - As much as we all like to think our dogs have good recall, when faced with something activating their natural hunting instincts, dogs might not return. Failure to keep your dog under control could result in a hefty fine and possible court action. Thank you

Six people sentenced in connection with drugs and trafficking offences 4

Keilo Senior, aged 20, of HMP Bullingdon, was sentenced to 12 years' imprisonment. He was found guilty of human trafficking by unanimous jury. He pleaded guilty to being concerned in the supply of crack cocaine and heroin.

Taysharn Frimpong-Modeste, aged 27, of Wellbeck Avenue, Hayes, London, was sentenced to nine years' imprisonment and given a Slavery and Trafficking Prevention Order. He was found guilty by unanimous jury of human trafficking. He pleaded guilty to being concerned in the supply of crack cocaine and heroin.

Tyrone Williams, aged 44, of Conegra Road, High Wycombe, was sentenced to two years' and four months' imprisonment and was given a Criminal Behaviour Order after he pleaded guilty to being concerned in the supply of cocaine and heroin.

Kelly TieTie, aged 20, of Gibney Terrace, Bromley, was sentenced to two years and six months' imprisonment and was given a Criminal Behaviour Order. She pleaded guilty to being concerned in the supply of cocaine and heroin, and possession of criminal property.

Raymond Allard, aged 48, of Station Road, High Wycombe, was sentenced to one year and eight months' imprisonment after he pleaded guilty to human trafficking.

Ellie Black, aged 20, of Bloomfield Road, Leicester, was sentenced to one year and six months' imprisonment, suspended for two years. She also received 15 days rehabilitation activity requirement and must undergo 150 hours of unpaid work. She pleaded guilty to human trafficking.

The six people who have been sentenced were part of a group who were seeking to make a profit from drugs and the ringleaders were seeking to recruit young people to deal drugs.

The Princes Risborough Neighbourhood Team held a scam and crime prevention event at Eaves Court in Princes Risborough today. We were joined by Buckinghamshire & Surrey Trading Standards who spoke with residents about ongoing scams and the best ways to keep safe by raising awareness of the tactics the scammers will use. #KeepingCommunitiesSafe





Our Neighbourhood Team have recently been working alongside our partners at the RSPCA following reports of neglected ponies and horses in Chalfont St Peter.

Two ponies were seized from this field last week however unfortunately both were so unwell they were subsequently put to sleep.

For witnesses after a girl of primary school age was touched over her clothing by a man.

Happened at around 5.50pm on Thursday on Westhorpe Road, Marlow.

The offender is described as a white man with very tanned skin, aged between 40 and 50, slim build, approximately 5ft 10 ins tall, with brown/ginger hair with grey streaks, which falls to the left hand side. The man had stubble of the same colouring, and was wearing a dark green jacket with black on the arms and collar, skinny jeans and black trainers.
