## Alcester Police SNTs. Latest Weekly Report. Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> August 2024

Based at Alcester Police Station, The Safer Neighbourhood team's primary roles are around crime prevention, problem solving both long standing or emerging issues of community concern and community engagement. We are supported at Alcester by colleagues from Patrol teams whose role is to respond to incidents and investigate crimes that occur in the area 24/7. The SNT is supervised by Inspector Hembry who leads on Neighbourhood Policing for Stratford District and Sgt Ebbs who also oversees neighbourhood Policing in the Shipston on Stour area. The Alcester SNT currently consists of 2 Police officers and 5 Police Community Support Officers, and our contact details are shown above.

### ALCESTER

### **Thank you and we remain prepared – 08/08/2024**

Warwickshire Police's Assistant Chief Constable has expressed his thanks as the force continues to respond to potential disorder in the wake of the ongoing period of national unrest.

Disinformation and fake news have driven disorder in small pockets across the country and we remain supportive of the national response - violence and disorder or hate crime will never be tolerated and offenders will be arrested and brought to justice swiftly, named and shared widely.

Assistant Chief Constable, Ben Smith said: "We are grateful to everyone who has reached out to us with information, concerns, or messages of support.

"We recognise that it is a challenging time but take great pride in the fact that many of our communities are supporting one another, standing side by side alongside their friends and neighbours against those trying to create divisions.

"It continues to be business as usual here in Warwickshire, but we remain part of a wider national policing operation and are prepared to respond locally if necessary.

"Violence and disorder or hate crime will never be tolerated – there is no place for hate in our society, and policing as a whole will do its utmost in supporting you and keeping you safe.

"Anyone with concerns or information is urged to come forward and report it so that we can best protect the public."

### **Police appeal for witnesses following fatal collision, B439 Evesham Road,**

**Stratford upon Avon - 05/08/2024**

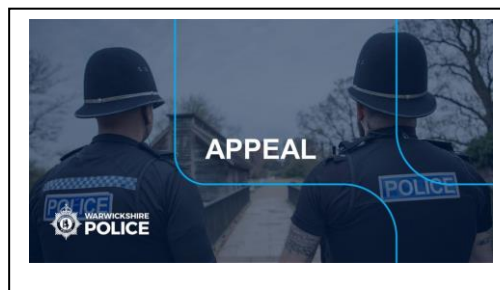
Police are appealing for witnesses to a fatal road traffic collision that occurred on the B439 Evesham Road near to the junction with Wixford Road at approximately 6.10am on Sunday morning 4 August 2024.

The driver of a white coloured Audi A4 was driving towards Evesham along the A439 Evesham Road and the driver of a blue coloured Fiesta was driving in the direction of Stratford upon Avon when the collision occurred.

The driver of the Fiesta, a 60-year-old man from Evesham was declared deceased at the scene.

The 28-year-old driver of the Audi A4 and his 18-year-old female passenger were both seriously injured and were taken by ambulance to University Hospital Coventry and Warwickshire for further assessment and treatment where they remain with serious injuries.

The investigation into the collision is in the early stages and officers are appealing for any witnesses who saw either vehicle in the time leading up to the collision, or anyone with dashcam footage or CCTV to please contact PC 1616 Russell Pennington of the Serious Collision Investigation Unit by email at [sciu@warwickshire.police.uk](mailto:sciu@warwickshire.police.uk) or by phoning 101 quoting incident 46 of 4 August 2024.



## Electric bikes: licensing, tax and insurance

You can ride an electric bike if you're 14 or over, as long as it meets certain requirements. These electric bikes are known as 'electrically assisted pedal cycles' (EAPCs). You do not need a licence to ride one and it does not need to be registered, taxed or insured.

### What counts as an EAPC?

An EAPC must have pedals that can be used to propel it.

It must show either:

- the power output.
- the manufacturer of the motor

It must also show either:

- the battery's voltage
- the maximum speed of the bike

Its electric motor:

must have a maximum power output of 250 watts.

should not be able to propel the bike when it's travelling more than 15.5mph

An EAPC can have more than 2 wheels (for example, a tricycle).

### Where you can ride

If a bike meets the EAPC requirements, it's classed as a normal pedal bike. This means you can ride it on cycle paths and anywhere else pedal bikes are allowed.

### Other kinds of electric bike

**Any electric bike that does not meet the EAPC rules is classed as a motorcycle or moped and needs to be registered and taxed. You'll need a driving licence to ride one and you must wear a crash helmet.**

Getting vehicle approval for your electric bike

An electric bike must be type approved if either:

it can be propelled without pedalling (a 'twist and go' EAPC)

it does not meet the EAPC rules.

This should have been done by the manufacturer or importer before you bought it. If it's been type approved, it will have a plate showing its type approval number.
