CURRENT WARD PRIORITIES – Drug dealing, Youth disorder and speeding/traffic issues with Withdean.

Drug dealing – We have had a flurry of reports for Dyke Road Park; these range at different times and descriptions given have been noted. Please continue with your reports as your reports help us build a bigger picture of when and where this is going on in the park.

Youth disorder – We have had fewer reports of youth disorder at the moment; however, youth disorder continues in other wards in the city.

Speeding/ traffic issues – Whilst at the last community meeting a few people came forward about cars using Tongdean Lane as a cut through (which is an access only road).

Ward Patrols

- Patrols of Dyke Road Park and surrounding areas continue and will continue until we get no reports for periods of time but even then, I will be in and around the area keeping eyes out for any problems
- Park patrols in the ward continue to keep Youth disorder at bay however patrols will be around the ward and nearby wards for support with other youth disorder.
- I have been out and about in the Tongdean lane area.
