## #YouSaid - What matters to you

**PRIORITY 1**—Anti-Social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park continues as a priority concern from the community. Over the spring period, the team will continue to concentrate on this location.

**We Did**- Anti-social behaviour in and around Braunstone Park remains a priority concern raised by the community. Throughout June, the beat team has again continued to focus activity in this location as part of ongoing spring and summer policing plans, aiming to provide reassurance, deter ASB and positively engage with park users.

Officers have continued to carry out regular high-visibility patrols in and around Braunstone Park, maintaining a visible presence to discourage anti-social behaviour and address concerns as they arise.

**PRIORITY 2**—Road safety has been highlighted to be a local concern. We will continue to concentrate on speeding concerns and anti social behaviour caused by e bikes, e scooters and off road motorbikes.

**We Did**—Particular concerns remain around speeding and anti-social behaviour involving e-bikes, e-scooters and off-road motorbikes.

Throughout June, the team has maintained a proactive approach to tackling these issues. A targeted road safety operation was carried out, resulting in the seizure of two illegal e-bikes. These vehicles were being used unlawfully and posed a clear risk to both pedestrians and other road users. Their removal demonstrates continued enforcement against nuisance and dangerous riding behaviour.

In addition to enforcement activity, officers have continued to carry out patrols in key areas identified through community feedback, ensuring a visible presence to deter anti-social use of vehicles and reassure residents.

The beat team will continue to prioritise road safety through a combination of high-visibility patrols and targeted operations, focusing on speeding and vehicle-related ASB.

**PRIORITY 3**—Drug dealing and usage at locations across the Braunstone and Rowley Fields area is a concern.

**We Did**—Throughout June, the beat team has continued a proactive and intelligence-led approach, focusing on disruption, enforcement, and high-visibility patrols within known hotspot locations. These patrols are aimed at deterring activity, gathering information, and reassuring the community.

During this period, the team has successfully executed a misuse of drugs warrant, resulting in the seizure of a quantity of Class B drugs. Work is ongoing to secure further drug warrants, which will be executed in due course as part of continued efforts to disrupt local drug supply and associated criminality.

In addition, officers have continued to engage with residents across the ward, gathering valuable intelligence and maintaining awareness of developing issues. Information provided by the community remains vital in supporting our operations and directing our patrols.

We continue to encourage residents to report any suspicious activity, including suspected drug dealing, unusual behaviour around properties, or frequent short-term visitors.

It's been a busy and successful month for the team! Here is just a snippet of some of the good work from officers;

PCSOs Julie and Beth recovered a van on Fullhurst Avenue after discovering it had been untaxed since October 2025.

After a vehicle failed to stop for PCs George and Paige on two separate occasions, PCSO Julie's eagle eyes came to the rescue when she later spotted it parked up, leading to its recovery.

PCSOs Julie and Beth also recovered another untaxed van on Boynton Road.

PC Paige joined Leicester City Council colleagues at The Grove to support an event for ASB Awareness Week, helping engage with the community and raise awareness around anti-social behaviour.

Great teamwork all round and some fantastic proactive policing efforts!
