What we have been doing in your community

Your local St Giles Safer Neighborhood Team has been actively working across the ward to keep St Giles safe and to support vulnerable residents. Here are some of the key activities from this month:

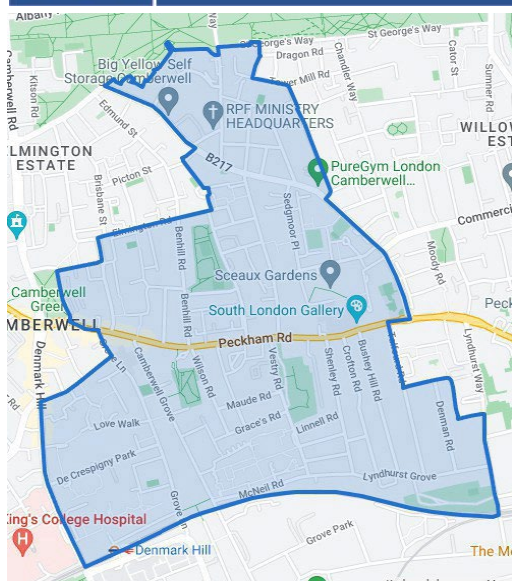
Bike Marking Event :St Giles and Camberwell Green safer Neighborhood Team held a joint bike- marking on **Friday 14 November 2025** Elmington Estate event aimed at helping residents protect their bicycles and reduce theft in the local area. bike marking is an effective crime-prevention measure, as it enables officers to identify and trace stolen bicycles, significantly increasing the likelihood of successful recovery. The teams will be organizing further bike-marking events in the near future to ensure more residents have the opportunity to benefit from this service. We would like to extend our sincere thanks to everyone who brought their bikes and supported this proactive safety initiative.

Breach of the peace: ST Giles officers prevented a breach of the peace on the **Lettsom Estate** to assist a resident in collecting some of his personal belongings. Officers successfully managed the situation. and the resident was satisfied with the outcome.

Closure order: on 10/10/25 at Croydon Magistrate Court ST Giles SNT successfully applied for a closure order on a flat in SE5, where the occupant had committed anti-social behaviour towards other residents. The closure order prevents the occupant from returning to the flat and brings respite to the community who have been affected by the occupant's behavior. ST Giles SNT and Southwark council are working in partnership for a long term resolution to the matter.

Safeguarding Visits to Vulnerable Persons: Officers have been carrying out visits to individuals identified as potentially vulnerable to "cuckooing". This is when offenders take advantage of someone often due to health issues, isolation or addiction by taking over their home to use it for criminal or anti-social purposes. These visits allow us to check on residents' welfare, offer safeguarding advice, and work with partner agencies to put protection measures in place if needed.

Partnership Working to Tackle Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB): The team has been attending joint partnership meetings with Southwark council to look at ways of tackling persistent anti-social behaviour in the area. By working together, we can use a combination of enforcement, housing interventions and support services to find long-term solutions.
