#YouSaid - What matters to you

Below are our beat priorities -

Priority:

1. Dealing with anti-social behaviour and road safety involving the illegal use of e-scooters and e-bikes across the ward.

Action taken:

1. We Did: We continue to target antisocial behaviour connected to e-scooters and e-bikes where possible. During this period we have seized e-scooters/e-bikes as part of a wider effort to reduce drug taking and anti-social behaviour in the Glenfield Road East area.

Priority:

2. Dealing with the production of class B drugs on the area, in addition to tackling the use and supply of both class A and B drugs in areas where this affects the local community.

Action taken:

2. We Did: In August we continued the excellent work targeting this issue. As a beat team we've conducted or instigated well over 20 stop searches since the middle of July and throughout August. As a result, we've found approximately 16 people in possession of drugs, 2 in possession of stolen property and have arrested several persons for being wanted for other, pre-existing matters. This proactive approach will continue into September.

Priority:

3. Reducing vehicle crime, including damage to, theft from and theft of motor vehicles on the beat.

Action taken (this relates to the previous priority around ASB):

We Did: Vehicle crime continues to be an issue, with some offences reported to us in August. We continue to regularly patrol the affected areas, such as Tudor Road and the surrounding streets. We've also aimed to assist the investigations into most if not all of these offences by conducting timely CCTV and house to house enquiries ourselves as a beat team, to assist with identifying those responsible.

What we are doing



Welcome to the August edition of the Fosse Neighbourhood Team Newsletter.

This month has seen the beat team concentrating on the Glenfield East Road area. Numerous community members had approached us and reported that there was an increase in anti-social behaviour, drinking and drug taking at this location.

To tackle this a Problem Management Plan (PMP) has been created where all incidents and actions taken are recorded. This helps us to monitor and update intelligence and to be aware of the current status of individuals involved.

A number of individuals have been searched over the last few weeks, drugs have been recovered and arrests made. The local council have also been out to hear the concerns of local residents and business owners, holding a joint walk in the area.

This will not be something that can be solved overnight, but the team are working hard with the resources available to make the community safer.
