## #YouSaid - What matters to you

We have listened to your concerns and prioritised the following in May 2025:

#### Priority 1: Anti-social Behaviour

- You Said: Reports of anti-social behaviour around "The Black Path" include youths throwing items at houses and knocking on doors.
- Our Action: Patrols of the Beaumont Walk have continued throughout May. We have seen a dramatic decrease in reports being made to us about anti-social behaviour on Beaumont Walk. Considering this we will be looking to change are priority to target a new location where issues are happening.

#### **Priority 2: Retail Shop Thefts**

- You Said: Retailers and security at the Beaumont Leys Shopping Centre have on-going problems with shoplifting and threats against store staff.
- Our Action: A Problem Management Plan has been established. We collaborate with retail stores and security personnel to address the offenders. Crime prevention patrols are being conducted by both uniformed and plain-clothed officers

#### **Priority 3: Thefts from Motor Vehicles**

- You Said: Addressing the increase in thefts from motor vehicles, particularly at Heathley Park. Light commercial vehicles are being specifically targeted for tools left inside overnight.
- Our Action: The beat team is working with local businesses in the area to locate weaknesses and prioritise our patrols
  to strengthen them areas. May has seen 0 reports of theft from vehicles in the Heathley Park area, however we plan to
  continue patrols through June.

## **Local News May**



- The neighbourhood team has been busy this May with patrols, covering response, beat engagement events, assisting with scenes and helping out with CCTV enquiries.
- PCSO Kurtis has been working with the Beaumont Shopping Centre security team to identify prolific offenders for anti-social behaviour. These are then linked in with Youth Engagement Officer to offer diversionary clubs or options to deter their current behaviour.
- PC Sam and Sam made a visit an address on Torridon Close after concerns for the occupant was raised to police. A safeguarding report was completed which flags the concerns to support agencies.
- PCSO Jaik and PC Sam found a wanted man in a car and boxed in the vehicle. This did not deter the suspect from trying to make a run for it but thanks to quick feet and tactical comms over the radio, he was detained and arrested. A search of the vehicle uncovered weapons and drugs inside these were seized and the driver was questioned.
- PCSO Kurtis assisted PC Tony with enquiries at Gilroes Cemetery following damage to some lights. Following up the area was not covered by CCTV but Council report wildlife often responsible for damage to property left at graves.
- PC Sam is managing issues on Glazedale Close after multiple reports of youths booting doors in the area.
- During the month of June we plan to patrol are green spaces more as we often see an increase in motorbike use and crimes during the summer.
