### **BEAT PRIORITIES**

<u>Burglary:</u> Beat officers to put up footprint on ALL residential burglaries and ensure safeguarding for the occupants and that support is in place. Offer alarms where necessary and victim support where needed. Beat officers to support with CCTV/Statement enquiries where demand allows and ensure safeguarding reports are completed to those who need it. <u>Road Safety, Drug Dealing</u>: As a team we are planning on increasing the road safety operations such as Belgrave Road. Working with partner agencies, and we are working on this to aid education around road safety and the impacts RTC's have on everyone involved. We will be looking at enforcing on illegal E-Bikes and E-Scooters.

<u>Street Drinking and General ASB:</u> Officers conducting active high visibility patrols within known hotspots areas. Robustly gathering details where possible of those involved in ASB. Repeat offenders will be dealt with via the incremental approach. Beat Team working with local council and CAP partners to tackle street drinking within the area. Drug dealing/cuckooing has become apparent on the area and officers remain vigilant.

<u>ATM distraction Thefts:</u> Increase visible and covert patrols around high-risk ATMs, especially during early morning hours when thefts often occur.

#### BELGRAVE – CITY WARDENS

Belgrave officers have a great working partnership with the LCC City Warden for the neighbourhood and this partnership was strengthened recently when the City Warden joined Belgrave officers PC 865 and PC 1327 for patrols on the neighbourhood.



### SPEED GUN - TARGETING THE ROADS



PC 4225 Manani and PCSO 6196 Spendilow – Headed to the streets to monitor vehicle speeds and vehicle related crimes following ongoing issues within the community.

It was our first initial trail after being able to secure a Traffic Speed Monitor Device in the Belgrave, with great results, Officers will be hitting key locations within the upcoming weeks.



### VEHICLE PARKING ISSUES

Belgrave officer PC Thomas 1327 was out and about when they found a vehicle parked on the road that had been reported as SORN (Statutory Off-Road Notification) which is a formal declaration to the DVLA that the vehicle is being taken off the road.

This means that the vehicle isn't being driven or parked on a public road and is parked on a driveway, parked on private land or in a garage.



### **OPERATION SYPHON**

Over the coming weeks Officers will be carrying out Operation Syphon across East Leicester — a proactive road safety initiative focused on:

### JOINT PARTNERSHIP







Our #SaferStreetsTeam have been continuing to complete hi-visibility patrols this week on Belgrave Road and Cossington park.
