As reports of online Fraud and Scams continue to rise across Scotland and impact our everyday lives, there are simple steps that we can take to keep ourselves, friends and families safe.

 Be suspicious of unsolicited contact through phone calls, text, email, WhatsApp or social media delivering offers that appear too good to be true. Many of these communications come with a deadline to pressure us into making a decision. If you receive a phone call or message of this nature, ignore it or hang up.

Remember - ask a friend or relative for a second opinion or call the Cyber and Fraud Hub helpline to assist on 0808 281 3580.

- Be wary of offers on social media offering investment or other financial advice. For financial advice, you should always contact an organisation that is registered with the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA).
- 'Ask Silver' is an Al-powered scam checking tool that is
 facilitated in WhatsApp and helps users check out potential
 SCAMS. If you receive a suspicious message, email or letter, send
 a photo to 'Ask Silver' and you will receive an immediate
 response advising you if the message is genuine or not!
 Check it out at: Ask Silver- Free Scam Checker.

As cyber-enabled crime continues to evolve, the Cyber and Fraud Hub remains a central resource for its members.

Updated regularly with alerts, practical guidance, learning modules, and support contacts, the Hub helps individuals and communities build resilience against online harm.

From phishing and delivery scams to fake investment schemes and festive fraud spikes, the Hub empowers members with the knowledge needed to stay safe in an increasingly digital world.
