Below are the issues that the community policing team are dealing with ...

WEAVER HALL / ROSE MEADOW

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Neighbours are deliberately causing parking issues by blocking people in—**PCSO ROBERTSON** is working with **WEAVER VALE** in regards to this, monitoring the issue and looking at the issue

LEFTWICH

ASB / CAUSED FOR CONCERN

- Male getting threats from a former friend and has items that are not being returned—**officers are looking into this**
- 2 reports of loud banging and flashes of light coming from the building site—**FIRE** have conducted a full walk around, and there is no causes for concern
- Two males were seen on CCTV looking over a fence into someone's garden—**RESPONSES** officers dispatched and search of area made—no trace
- Young males seen entering the LEFTWICH COMMUNITY BUILDING—
- Further report in regards to males being inside the LEFTWICH COMMUNITY BUILDING possibly stripping the Copper—**PCSO ROBERTSON** has contacted the representative from **CHESTER WEST AND CHESTER COUNCIL** in regard to this. Boarding up as been conducted by **CWAC** and perimeter fences are now secure.

HIGHWAY OBSTRUCTION

- Vans parking on double yellow lines whilst building work is ongoing and making it difficult for vehicles to get passed — **These vehicles have been noticed by PCSO ROBERTSON**, but as there is building work ongoing and they are offloaded and loaded the van, this is allowed. As you are allowed to park on double yellow lines whilst loading and unloading vehicles

KINGSMEAD

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Antisocial behaviour issues with a male youth who has gained access to a communal area in a building—**PCSO ROBERTSON** is already aware of this issue as reporting person has contacted him in regards to this.
- Concerns over a young boy seen by CORONET AVE POND , with no parents present—**RESPONSE OFFICERS** located the young boy who was with his mum , as he had been to family members who live near by and was making his way home.
- Assault that occurred due to an end of a relationship, which also involved possible stalking—**RESPONSE officers** are investigating this
- Threat left on school answering machine—School went into lockdown and the threat was no credible. School done correct procedure , PCSO ROBERTSON was in contact with school whilst off duty.

FRAUD

- Text Message received asking for money stating that they are a family member – **No Money has been sent , information has been passed as INTEL. PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct reassurance visit.**



DAVENHAM

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

Post has been placed on facebook regarding the reporting person, which may be linked to previous neighbour disputes—**PCSO ROBERTSON has been contacted by the reporting person and will be looking into this as dealt with previous issues**

Reporting persons son and friend was walking past a bungalow and a woman left her property and approached them to give them a present—**The boys did not engage—processed as INTEL and PCSO will conduct a reassurance visit.**

Threatening phone calls to reporting persons workplace—**PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct reassurance call**

Issue within HIGH SCHOOL between two female has brought parent of one female to get involved and threaten the other female—**RESPONSE OFFICERS are investigating and PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct reassurance call**

HIGHWAY OBSTRUCTION

Van broken down on the junction of JACK LANE / LONDON ROAD —**Vehicle now recovered by owner as vehicle had a flat battery**

BOSTOCK

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Two males suspicious seen on

HIGHWAY OBSTRUCTION

- Vehicle possibly parking and blocking driveway of reporting person—**Vehicle details have been passed over to PCSO ROBERTSON and been placed onto parking**
- Van that is parking on footpath from 1900 onwards and blocking it—**Both of the above are now on parking patrols which are being conducted by PCSO ROBERTSON**

- Two sheep have been attacked by dogs—**owner of the dogs spoken to , dogs escaped when gate was opened and owner will cover the costs.**

Male getting abuse and threats from third parties after telling a female not to pet his dogs—**PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct reassurance visit]**

Suspicious van been parked outside the reporting persons house, feels very intimidated—**PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct reassurance visit**


