On 11th January 2026, Lavender Safer Neighbourhood's Team were conducting patrols around St John's Road, SW11. During the patrols, officers sighted a male involved in anti-social behaviour in the area. Officers arrested the male for Common Assault and issued an ASB warning notice. The shop issued a banning letter to the male. The investigation into the assault is ongoing.

Lavender Safer Neighbourhoods Team (SNT) are writing to you in relation to parcel theft in the area.

We are not a 24/7 team and we work a range of early, days and late shifts, however there is a 24/7 response team who respond to 999 calls. We have been made aware of occasional reports of parcel theft in the area however these are few and far between. We would like to encourage residents to report incidents to us detailing times and frequency so that we can target patrols in the area and be fully aware of the impact this is having on you. Looking on our systems there is a clear under reporting of incidents.

Our team are going to conduct a Street Briefing which is when officers from a Safer Neighbourhood's Team patrol in an area during a specific time so residents can speak to their local officers in person. Lavender SNT will be conducting a Street Briefing in Gowrie Road and Marney Road, SW11 on Wednesday 28th January 2026, between 12:00 and 13:00.




Watch out!

Parcel thefts are happening in your area.



BE SAFE

Watch out!



Parcel thieves are opportunistic and will steal deliveries that have been left outside your home. Thieves are likely to return to the same area again, using similar tactics.

Help avoid your parcels being stolen by:

- Tracking your parcel to ensure somebody is home for the delivery.
- Arranging for it to be left with a neighbour if nobody will be home.
- Using an off-site locker service for frequent deliveries or expensive items; these are more likely to be in busy places rather than secluded areas that could be targeted by thieves.
- Installing a video doorbell; you will be notified of any delivery on your phone and is easier to install than CCTV.
- Install a security light.
