What matters to you:

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and prioritised the following:

Priority 1: Anti-social behaviour

You Said: Anti-social behaviour within your area is causing a concern. This includes acts of drug taking, excessive noise from vehicles and groups of youths.

What we are going to do: The local neighbourhood team will be targeting individuals responsible for causing anti-social behaviour around South Wigston and ensuring appropriate enforcement measures are used to deal with offenders.

Priority 2: Road traffic Issues

You Said: Issues in relation to parking, speeding and anti-social driving are causing concerns in your area.

What we are going to do: Police volunteers will be organising vehicle speed checks at identified locations. We will continue to target drivers who are speeding, not wearing seatbelts, using mobile phones and drink/drug driving. Local officers have received reports of identified vehicles being driven without valid insurance, MOT and tax, these vehicles are being dealt with.

We will engage with our specialist colleagues to establish safe and effective methods to deal with illegal and nuisance motorcycles riding in residential areas.

Anti-social behaviour (ASB)

Anti-social behaviour (ASB) takes many forms, from aggressive, noisy, or abusive behaviour to neighbourhood disturbances involving drugs or animals. We have been working in conjunction with partner agencies such as local councils, housing, and wellbeing services to tackle and prevent ASB using a problem-solving approach to achieve the best results. The local neighbourhood team have identified individuals responsible for causing anti-social behaviour around the South Wigston. As a result several ASB warning letters have been issued to the more prolific offenders, and some have received community resolutions. We are now seeing a reduction in reports of ASB in the worst-affected areas.



Road traffic Issues

Speeding and inconsiderate driving have been identified as main concerns for South Wigston residents, as well as uninsured/unregistered motorcycles and e-scooters.

The local beat team have increased visible patrols in hotspot areas, and combined with calls and intelligence reports from members of the public have been able to recover several stolen vehicles

utilised in crime. We are planning a speed awareness event with our police volunteers in order to monitor areas worst effected by speeding – with this we will issue relevant warnings and offence reports to those caught.



In your community

We continue to hear positive feedback when we are seen to be visible in the community, so we have been out on the beat as much as possible, engaging with the public to establish areas of concern. With information received we have recovered several vehicles either used in crime or driving without relevant documentation.

We have attended community events and run a beat surgery and crime prevention event in South Wigston in order to reach more members of the community.
