This month, we have said "Gday" to our much loved PC Andy Brett who is bravely leaving with his family for the sunny shores of Australia .. We all wish you and your family safe travels and happy days in the sunshine!



With information provided through Beat Surgeries, talking to the community and Neighbourhood Link, we have noticed that the three main issues concerning our community are;

Priority 1: YOU SAID: Members of the Community have expressed concerns about the increase in the use of illegal escooters in public, particularly in the area of Abbey Rise and Mowmacre areas.

WE DID: The As a repeat priority, we continue to have increased patrols in the areas concerned, targeting such vehicles and providing advice to users of e-scooters. So far several e-scooters have been seized due to riders not heeding the warnings. We continue to monitor and patrol the area.

Priority 2: YOU SAID: Members of the Community and shop staff have explained that they are concerned about Anti-Social Behaviour, thefts and criminal damage being reported at shops in the area of Belgrave Boulevard and Bewcastle Grove.

WE DID: A Problem Management Plan has been created for the area for officers to collate evidence re the issues. Working with the affected businesses in the area, including the business area management; new equipment and further support has been identified to support them, including improved CCTV and the provision of body worn cameras, thus providing supporting evidence to Police regarding offenders. Multi agency meetings around partnership working with Leicester City Council and the affected businesses in the area to further understand the issues have been competed and the situation is continued to be monitored.

Priority 3: YOU SAID: Vehicles speeding in residential areas, particularly around Parker Drive, Halifax Drive and Heacham Drive.

WE DID: Joined up partnership working with the road safety unit and taskings sent to the Road Safety Unit, including using the Special Constabulary. Multiple speeding operations have been completed in the areas at various times of the day, with residents supporting the operations.

These operations are displayed and shown on social media platforms. The Beat Team will continue to compete checks in the areas and engage with the residents.

ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

We have , on The Abbey Ward seen a sudden increase in Anti Social Behaviour in recent weeks . ASB can have a massive impact on peoples lives in many ways and we refuse to tolerate this kind of behaviour.

When reports of ASB are received, the Team work with our partnership agencies such as Leicester City Council and other housing providers, as well as our Crime and Anti Social behaviour Unit to identify the perpetrators.





Once identified, we will immediately be working with the Perpetrators along the incremental process issuing such things as advice/warning letters and acceptable behaviour contracts working up to court proceedings, which if ignored could eventually cause families to lose their house.

If vulnerabilities or a need for diversionary projects are identified, then this too will be acted upon in order to solve the problems long term rather than just applying a "sticking plaster".

If you are experiencing forms of ASB please don't suffer in silence or take matters into your own hands . Our officers are always out and about for you to speak to , or you can attend one of our many Beat Surgery locations detailed within this newsletter or alternatively report to us online or via our 101 service.


