I wanted to update you on Operation Limit. Following a month of intensive roads enforcement in December, Sussex Police saw a significant increase in action taken against drink and drug driving.

In total, officers made a record 279 arrests across the county.

We are committed to keeping our roads safer and will continue to target those who drive under the influence and put others at risk. Our message remains clear: Think you won't get caught? Think again.

It has been a busy start to the year for our PCSOs, with planning and attending community meetings across their wards. These meetings are a fantastic opportunity for PCSOs to meet local residents and gain a better understanding of any issues or concerns within their communities.

Top 3 tips to stay secure!



Lock up - always lock doors and windows when you go out, even for a moment, and regularly update key safe codes.



Make your home look occupied - consider using light timer switches and, if possible, install an alarm or CCTV.



Keep valuables out of sight and hide car keys - don't make it easy for thieves.

If you see or hear anything suspicious or spot unusual activity, please report it to us right away.

A few minutes spent securing your home, and one quick call if something doesn't feel right, can make all the difference.
