Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you.

You Said	We did
ASB incidents such as: Vehicle nuisance or inappropriate use. Rowdy or inconsiderate behaviour. Littering or drugs paraphernalia.	Our police officers are addressing reports of anti-social behaviour by including initiatives such as targeted patrols around key areas. As the school summer holidays are due to start these will be increased and with more hot weather we would urge parents to educate your children in safety around water.
Concerns relating to Road Safety whether it be parking, speeding or loud cars/bikes a causing nuisance or being ridden in an anti-social manner.	We have been conducting regular patrols to improve road safety across the area, including stopping vehicles where offences have been identified. Officers have taken action in relation to issues such as speeding, mobile phone use and other road traffic offences as well as engaging with drivers to offer advice and promote safer driving.
Drug dealing on the beat is still a priority.	We have held beat surgeries to speak to local residents, we are gathering and developing intelligence, and, where sufficient evidence is obtained, applying for warrants. We rely on your ongoing support and information provided by yourselves to assist us in this work.

News

We recently attended a beat surgery in Earl Shilton, giving us the opportunity to speak with local residents in a relaxed and friendly setting. During the session, concerns were raised about: Speeding vehicles in the area and drug use within the community. These issues have been noted and will be considered as part of our ongoing neighbourhood policing work. We also shared crime prevention advice and provided a range of leaflets covering topics such as personal safety, scams, and home security. Thank you to everyone who came along to chat with us – your feedback is invaluable and helps us focus on what matters most to you. Keep an eye on our social media page for upcoming beat surgeries and community events.



Officers attended the Age Concern Friendship Group, speaking with local residents about issues that matter most to you. We've been discussing concerns including Parking issues in residential areas, Anti-social behaviour in parks and open spaces and General community safety. These conversations are vital in helping us understand your concerns and shape how we patrol and respond. If you see us out and about, please come and have a chat – we're here to listen and help. We're always keen to engage with the community and hear about any concerns affecting your area.

PCSO Ebonie attended the Earl Shilton Cricket Club on Keats Lane earlier last month in relation to reports of criminal damage. The perimeter fence has been repeatedly damaged and there is now a significant hole between the park and the cricket club grounds. We have spoken to a representative of the cricket club, who advised that this is a recurring issue occurring on a weekly basis. Officers have logged this as criminal damage and are reviewing CCTV in the area. If you have any information please contact 101 quoting 26000328883.
