

## **Brunswick and Adelaide PCSO Monthly Update**

Hello everyone! This is your current ward update for Brunswick and Adelaide, looking back at the month just gone, and offering current crime prevention advice.

Within the month of May:

- Reports of ASB have increased somewhat. We do see increases in ASB particularly when the weather is nicer.
- Burglary has gone down to 1 report in the month of May.
- An increase in criminal damage from 4 reports in April to 7 reports in May

### **Crime Prevention Advice**

Due to the increase in ASB reports I thought I'd touch upon advice regarding ASB.

What is antisocial behaviour?

There are three main categories for antisocial behaviour, depending on how many people are affected:

- Personal antisocial behaviour is when a person targets a specific individual or group.
- Nuisance antisocial behaviour is when a person causes trouble, annoyance or suffering to a community.
- Environmental antisocial behaviour is when a person's actions affect the wider environment, such as public spaces or buildings.

Examples of ASB include:

- Parking issues and abandoned vehicles
- Animals (nuisance, aggressive or abandoned)
- Noise
- Fly-tipping
- Neighbour disputes
- Nuisance groups of people
- Vehicle nuisance
