## What have the team been doing?

Officers from The Safer Neighbourhood Team had the pleasure of visiting The Bewdley School to support students taking part in mock interviews. ### **Road Safety**



In response to our town/parish councils and residents raising concerns about the speed of traffic the team have been monitoring vehicle speeds on the A456 Bewdley Bypass, Clows Top, Bliss Gate Road, Heightington Road and Callow Hill.

Our speed surveys were carried out on different days and times and the results showed the majority of drivers adhered to speed limits helping to keep our roads safe.



The team have also carried out speed enforcement days on the A456 Bewdley Bypass however no speeding offences were recorded.

#### **Remembrance 2025**



PC Ginder and PC Littleford took part in the Remembrance Day parade in Bewdley town centre on Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> November. PCSO Bray attended Callow Hill to lay the wreath on behalf of the team.

#### **Business Week of Action**



Business week of action took place week beginning 10<sup>th</sup> November as part of the ongoing police and partnership response to tackling retail crime, anti-social behaviour and other crimes impacting businesses in local communities.

As part of this the team visited local building sites to offer crime prevention advice and supply property marking items for onsite tools.



## **ASB Vehicles in Bewdley**

As part of concerns raised by Bewdley Town Council the team have carried out targeted patrols in the area in relation to noisy and nuisance vehicles. We have engaged with and educated drivers in relation to loud exhausts, window tints and vehicle lights amongst other things. At the beginning of December the team carried out a Policing Operation as part of this.

#### Be Safe, Be Seen



On Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> November the team attended the Wyre Forest Visitor Centre and met up with the local running club 'Thiswomanruns'

This is a female based club from Bewdley who meet up on Sundays.

Officers gave crime prevention advice, personal attack alarms and high visibility items to the group.

## Thinking of buying an E Scooter for Christmas? Do you know the law?

Although electric scooters are available to buy, they are currently illegal to use on public roads, pavements, cycle lanes and pedestrian-only areas unless part of a legal e-scooter loan scheme. As there are no legal schemes in place in Herefordshire or Worcestershire, e-scooters can only be ridden on private land with the permission of the land-owner.

West Mercia Police are actively trying to reduce the anti-social behaviour caused in the community by the illegal use of e-scooters, as well as raising awareness of the law. Anyone found using them in public areas risks having the e-scooter seized by the police.

## **Ride Along Scheme**

West Mercia Police invite residents to join an officer from their Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) on patrol and experience firsthand how they work to resolve issues and concerns in the local area.

The Ride Along scheme is re-launching in Herefordshire, Shropshire and Worcestershire and offers members of the public an insight into front-line policing.



SNTs are made up of police officers, special constables, police community support officers and volunteers, supported by additional officers and staff from the wider area. They are dedicated to serving your community and resolving issues that matter the most to residents.

Successful applicants will accompany an SNT officer for their shift and experience what a day on duty might look like.

Chief Inspector Matt Sanders, who is leading the scheme, said:

"We are very excited to re-introduce the Ride Along scheme to the public.

"It is a fantastic opportunity for the residents of our three counties to have a real insight into how we police their towns and cities. We hope the scheme will strengthen relationships between police and the public and allow for one-to-one conversations while out on patrol in your area."

The Ride Along scheme is open to anyone aged 18 or over, and you must live in Herefordshire, Shropshire or Worcestershire.

## **Protecting your home during darker nights**



- 1. Low front boundary; keep hedges and walls at the front of your house low (under one metre) so burglars have nowhere to hide.
- 2. Secure side gate: keep side gates always locked. Open gates mean burglars can easily access your home without being seen by passers-by or neighbours.
- 3. High side and rear boundaries with trellis and spiky
  - defensive planting; keep hedges, walls and fences around your back garden high (over 1.8 metres). Add lightweight trellis to gates and fences and plant some prickly plants to make it harder for burglars to climb over.
- 4. Gravel driveway and path; gravel driveways and paths make it harder for burglars to go undetected.
- 5. Security light: install an outside security light so that intruders can't approach without being seen.
- 6. Intruder alarm system; install a burglar alarm system.
- 7. Secure your shed; always keep your shed locked and secured, and make sure it is anchored down to prevent it from being lifted to gain access. Often sheds contain valuables such as power tools and bicycles.
- 8. Never leave tools lying around; never leave tools lying around as they can be used as a way of breaking into your home.

### **Appeals for information**

- We continue to appeal to residents in the community to report all instances of crime and antisocial behaviour to assist us with building a picture and to target our activity to address the issues of most concern to our community.
- Members of the public can report and submit digital footage showing potential traffic offences
  via a secure online form. West Mercia Police's road traffic officers review each submission and
  take the appropriate action.
