News

The Closure Order at Cambridge Gardens remains in place until 2359hrs on 07/10/25. Anyone found in breach of this order are liable to be arrested and charged with the offence. As of 11/10/25, 1 person is awaiting trial for breaching the order. Residents and partners have reported that it has largely been a success. We will consider this tactic as an option to tackle future issues where appropriate.



4 warrants were executed on 2nd October, targeting people believed to be responsible for drug supply and the exploitation of children in the ward. 3 people were arrested and are on bail for various offences. The investigation is ongoing.

The issue of drug use and supply in Kingston Cemetery is still being tackled in collaboration with Kingston Council and others. In the October half term, Police Cadets will be clearing overgrowth and litter to reduce the available places to hide within the cemetery.


Community Engagement Events
