What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritize the following from October 2025

Priority 1: Drug issues. What we are going to do-

The beat team remain aware of ongoing drug issues on the beat, and we are working to gather intelligence surrounding this and identify those responsible. We intend to seek out those individuals in order to shut down supply lines and make the community a safer environment for everyone. Although the beat team are conducting their own work surrounding this, your voice matters and an insight from the community would be extremely beneficial to the beat team. If you have any concerns or anything to report, you can attend a local beat surgery and speak to one of the team, or you can report anonymously via crimestoppers.

Priority 2: Nuisance motorbikes. What we are going to do-

We have had a rise in reports regarding nuisance motorbikes around the beat, and as a result the beat team have changed a beat priority from speeding to nuisance motorbikes. This allows the team to better focus on issues that you have told us matter to you and what you wish to see improvement on. The beat team have taken steps to prioritise this issue as we are aware this is quite a pressing issue on the beat currently. Extra high visibility patrols have been put in place in hotspot areas that have been identified, such as Allendale playing fields and the playing field off Oakley Drive. If you notice any anti-social behaviour regarding bikes, please report this to us and provide VRN's if possible.

Priority 3: Retail theft. What we are going to do-

The beat team continue to work closely with staff of retail shops to identify well-known and prolific shoplifters on the beat, and have been carrying out high visibility patrols and engagements to deter shoplifters. As well as conducting CCTV enquiries to identify those responsible, the beat team have been working closely with retail shops to come up with deterrents and link in with any recent shoplifting reports in order to gather the relevant evidence needed to prosecute.
