Reports are being made of poor parking outside of schools which causes a risk to motorists and pedestrians. There have also been numerous reports of people using e-scooters on public roads with the proper insurance.	See below
Reports have been made of people using and dealing drugs in Hinckley.	As always, intelligence gathering continues to deal with those causing issues with drugs.
Throughout the summer months there has been a rise in anti-social behaviour in public spaces, for example on parks. These incidents include; vehicles causing a nuisance, rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour by youths, and littering of drug paraphernalia.	Building Site break in (Normandy Way, Hinckley) – Two youths stopped and details obtained after being seen on site. Thankfully it would seem this was more of a kids being kids than a attempt to take anything. Both parents have been spoken to and advice given re their behaviours.

News

Whilst patrolling the local area, a 999 call from a female who was home alone came in. She had heard someone knocking on her patio doors and trying the door handle. We blue lighted to the address and searched the garden immediately, upon arrival, thankfully, there was no one hiding in the garden or in the surrounding area. We advised her to call us if she heard anything else and to ensure all her windows and doors were secured and locked. Patrols in the area were increased. Over the month, LFRS, Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council, Leicestershire City Council camera vehicle and the Hinckley Police NH26 Neighbourhood Team joined forces for a joint parking operation outside Westfield Junior School, Hinckley. The aim of the campaign was simple: to keep pupils, parents, and staff safe during busy drop off and pick-up times. We engaged with drivers, offered advice around safe and considerate parking and addressed a number of parking concerns raised by the school and local residents. A huge thank you to everyone who parked responsibly — your cooperation makes a real difference to the safety of the school community. We'll continue working together to promote safer streets and support our local schools.
