Over the last 3 months Burglaries have been highlighted as a community concern.	A burglary from a flat in Garratt Square, Whetstone is currently being investigated. CCTV enquiries are continuing.
Road safety has been flagged as an issue and encompasses anti social driving in the form of car cruising.	Op Flux was conducted at Oakfield Park in Blaby, read below for details.
The local community have raised drug related issues as a new priority for the beat team.	Officers are developing intelligence across the beat in relation to drugs.

News

We are aware of ongoing parking issues near to a local pub in Whetstone, despite recent parking restrictions being put in place. Beat Officers have issued Advisory Notices to a number of vehicles blocking the pavement and will continue to monitor the situation in the coming weeks.

The Blaby beat team attended a report of a residential burglary that occurred in Glen Parva during the early hours. The burglary resulted in the theft of their prized car. Officers conducted fast-track enquiries and were able to locate the vehicle in Braunstone. It just so happens that the vehicle parked next to it was also stolen in a different burglary! Two cars recovered and two very happy owners. The investigations are ongoing to identify those involved in the burglaries.

Officers attended an RTC at The Dicken in Whetstone after a report came in from a member of the public that a car had lost control, left the road, and driven into a wall. Unfortunately this resulted in the driver being arrested for 'failing to provide' having refused a breathalyser test and was taken to the Leicester Royal Infirmary for a check over. Further enquiries are to be completed.



At approximately 22:41hrs on the 3rd June a call was received from an alarm monitoring company reporting that the alarm had been set off at SAVERS, 1 FORGE CORNER, ENDERBY ROAD, BLABY. Upon police arrival at approximately 22:47hrs no persons were on scene and the shop window had been partially cracked by having a brick thrown at it. The brick was still on the floor. The shop was checked and the alarm was still going off upon arrival. No entry was gained as the shutters were still locked and all the doors were secure. Enquiries are ongoing.

As part of a joint agency approach involving colleagues from Blaby Council, Op Flux was conducted during this month at Oakfield Park in Blaby with other officers and "spotters" out and about. We had numerous traffic offences in just 1 day and 2 arrests as a result of these stops. One being the driver of a commercial vehicle being wanted on warrant and a second being drug driving.
