

Kidbrooke Village & Sutcliffe Ward

Your Safer Neighbourhood Team targeted patrols around Sutcliffe Park, Pegler Square, Weigall Road and surrounding areas for antisocial behaviour which include drug dealing and drug consumption, shoplifting and VAWG. This is still an ongoing issue that we take very seriously, and we will continue to target over the coming weeks by undertaking proactive high-visibility and plain clothes patrols.

Officers arrested one male for breach of tag and conducted two stop and searches for drugs, multiple proactive interventions for shoplifting and ASB at Pegler Square.

Within the last week officers have in focus Autumn Nights, an initiative to tackle the seasonal increases in criminal offences over the Halloween and Fireworks periods. Violence with Injury, Theft,



- •Focus on ASB around peak times such as Halloween and Fireworks Night.
- •Be a visible and reassuring presence to the communities during the darker days.
- •Protect and safeguard all females on the Ward with regards to VAWG crimes.

The team joined the fun with Kidbrooke Community Hub (GCDA) and created a spooky Halloween display on our main entrance for the Kidbrooke Halloween Hunt.


The next Ward Panel will be held on the 20th of November 2025. If you would like to be part of the ward Panel, please email the Team at;
