Vehicle Seized

The vehicle shown being towed away in the picture was found to have no tax, no insurance or MOT, when PCs Lily Patterson and Ben Rowton spotted it parked up on the A5. It was also identified by police as having been used to transport other vehicles to an industrial estate. It was then seized under Section 165 of the Road Traffic Act. The suspected driver was also found to have been disqualified from driving.



Arrest for Vehicle Theft

In December, Nuneaton East officers conducting high visibility patrols came across the vehicle shown, which was parked on the side of the road. They checked the Police National Computer list and found that it had been Stolen in September. The vehicle was then recovered and one male was arrested and bailed pending further enquiries.



Arrests Following Appeal

Thank you to everyone who supported our appeal in December, for a 29-year-old Nuneaton man wanted for a robbery and other theft-related offences in the town. He was later spotted in town and despite jumping fences and hiding in gardens, he was quickly tracked and arrested. He was then remanded in custody for further action.



Action on Nuisance Bikes

In December, Nuneaton East Officers, PC Lily Patterson and PC Ben Rowley were following reports of ASB bikes in the area. The bike shown in the picture was seized after previously attempting to avoid contact with police. The rider was issued with a Section 59 Warning, and the bike now enjoys much quieter surroundings than it's used to — mainly because it can't go anywhere. We will continue the patrols in future and ideally find fewer motorbikes trying to showcase their escape skills.

Operation Resolve officers were out in Nuneaton town centre making sure that Christmas cheer stayed high and Grinch behaviour stayed low. That included escorting a rather 'Too merry' male out of the town centre for spreading nuisance rather than Christmas cheer. How to report Fraud

If you have been a victim of online scams, identity theft, or any type of fraud, you should report it at reportfraud.police.uk. Report Fraud has replaced Action Fraud as the national service for reporting cyber crime and fraud. This new service makes reporting quicker and easier, and ensures your information goes straight to the right team for investigation. Don't Drink and Drive

This is what it looks like when we pull you over into one of our drink and drug driving check sites. You will be asked to blow into a tube attached to a breathalyser device, which will tell us if you have any alcohol in your system. Many of the drivers we have stopped so far have passed the breath test,

Thanks to all of you who have been driving safely and legally.



THINK! When did you have your last drink?

Alcohol can stay in your system for well over 12 hours, so you may still be over the limit the next morning.

The chances of being caught are high.
