



Are you causing problems with?

Anti-Social Behaviour?

Anti-social behaviour covers a wide range of unacceptable activity that causes harm to an individual, to their community or to their environment.

Your behaviour could leave someone feeling frightened, upset or targeted in their neighbourhood or community. You could also be committing a crime.

Some examples of anti-social behaviour are:

- Rowdy behaviour in groups causing intimidation to passers-by
- Shouting, swearing and spitting in the street
- Littering
- Drinking alcohol and smoking drugs in the street
- Causing fires
- Criminal damage, including graffiti



The police, local authorities and other community safety partner agencies, such as Fire & Rescue and social housing landlords, all have the power to deal with anti-social behaviour and to help people who are suffering from it.

The police, local authorities and community safety partners not only have a duty to prevent crime and disorder, but also to ensure the people who live and work in the community are safe and feel safe.

Why are we speaking to you?

You are being spoken to by officers from the Community Impact Team because of your behaviour.

You may have been with a group involved in Anti-Social Behaviour or you may have committed it yourself.

Your details are being taken so we can record our meeting with you

Verbal warning

and discuss any support you or your family may need to help you to improve your behaviour.

If you are spoken to again in similar circumstances, we will consider taking further steps towards addressing our concerns, and may issue a verbal warning.

Support services available to help you

You may not realise what impact your behaviour has on others, so we would like to refer you to support services and share information with partner agencies to discuss how we can all work together to support you to prevent this from continuing.

The support available ranges from:

- 1-2-1 or group work with a dedicated keyworker
- Time with Youth mentor James Kirton (ex-team GB swimmer) to engage young people in a school setting
- In-house intervention
- Peer support and diversion schemes

Support

We want to support and divert you from this type of behaviour and signpost you towards other positive activities.

We will always look to tailor support for you, so please help us to work with you and your interests.

Taking necessary action

Sadly, if your anti-social behaviour continues, we will need to discuss the following options with you.

These include:

- Acceptable Behaviour Contracts (ABCs)
- Criminal Behaviour Orders (CBOs)
- Community Protection Notices (CPNs) or Civil Injunctions.
