Anti-Social Behaviour

Through our partnership working, with Sussex Police and the Neighbourhood Watch Association, plus routine monitoring of crime reporting websites for information about suspicious activity, people and vehicles, we are able to understand and respond to emerging trends.

Anti-Social Behaviour

We were contacted by a resident who had their home pelted with eggs by two, young, male presenting teenagers. Further investigation has secured footage which may enable the suspects to be identified, and the matter has also been referred to Sussex Police.

We were alerted to an incident where again, a resident had their front door forcibly kicked on more than one occasion, luckily not causing permanent damage, but triggering considerable distress to the young children that live there. Due to a great community spirit and neighbourly concern, the two suspects were challenged by residents and their parents called. The matter has been resolved with the appropriate words of advice being issued in conjunction with the police, and the boys delivering a suitable apology together with assurances that it would not happen again.

24/01 – We were alerted to an organised gathering of car enthusiasts at Oakhurst Business Park due to excess vehicle noise and ASB driving. The matter was referred to Sussex Police.

27/01 – We received reports of a group of young people causing a disturbance in Lintot Square. The police were called and the group were identified and challenged. Their details were obtained and their parents informed. They are all now banned from a specific premises in the square and will be individually met by police for follow-up action.

Crime

We were made aware of an overnight incident where three people were seen between 0000-0500 hours gaining access to insecure vehicles and stealing items of value from them. If you have been a victim or have any usable CCTV images, please contact Sussex Police and they will take you through a simple process to give them your footage. If you ever notice suspicious activity, and are able to, please report it to the police at the time so that an appropriate response can be achieved.



For the last two months we have been working with some of our local commercial advertisers to reduce the amount of unlawful signage on display in the parish. During the course of our investigation, we located a number of signs which were not only illegally sited, but some had been bolted into the composite road-name signs causing permanent damage. We provided the offenders with written guidance and instructed them to stop. As one company has since re-offended on at least 2 occasions, the matter has been reported to the Police as criminal damage and HDC are consulting on legal action to recover costs relating to repairs.

22/01 – We received a report alleging that a male presenting adult made racist remarks to shop staff. Incidents like this are completely unacceptable and should be reported to the police. If you were present at the time and witnessed the incident, please contact Sussex Police.

Parking/vehicles

We continue to receive reports relating to the anti-social use of a vehicles, especially at school pick-up and drop-off times presenting a risk to children. We regularly patrol at these times and routinely try to gain the cooperation of parents some of whom positively engage having genuinely not seen the problems they are causing. There is a constant minority who want to enter unproductive debates about the definition of being 'parked'. For clarity, if your vehicle is stationary on a zigzag, on a double yellow line or in a bus stop you are committing an offence, and a Fixed Penalty Notice can be issued.

During recent sessions, several issues were identified, and we have since successfully provided the necessary follow-up assistance and support.

A warm welcome to the residents now settled at Charmans Lodge! To support their integration, the Lodge Manager has organised regular meet-ups in the Owners' Lounge. We have been invited to join these informal meetings, allowing us to build relationships with our new neighbours, listen to their feedback and provide any necessary support.

Patrols

- We continue patrols of local businesses designed to disrupt shoplifting, ASB and improve engagement.
- We continue to provide high visibility patrols both on foot and in a liveried vehicle throughout the Parish.

Older, Vulnerable People, and Youth

We routinely conduct high visibility patrols at times and in areas often used by older residents to offer a reassuring presence plus cover areas previously connected with ASB, to act as a deterrent. By undertaking home visits to vulnerable residents, we were able to sign post support services.

We received a report of an incident that took place on Sunday 4th January 2026 around Cripplegate Lane, and the Country Park where a resident was bitten by a dog. This caused injury and a serious infection developed. The matter has been reported to the police. Parish specific/other

Public Enquiries

This month we responded to 15 enquiries from residents by phone, email or in person and where necessary, signposted them to the most appropriate support services. These enquires included topics such as ASB, welfare concerns, hazards and help reporting crimes.

Hazards

02/01 – We attended 3 road traffic collisions within the parish following the change in weather. We checked on those involved and supported traffic management, and vehicle recovery where needed.

03/01 – We were alerted by a resident to a knife that had been discarded on a grass verge in one of our residential streets. We liaised with our local PCSO, recovered the knife and handed it to the police for destruction.

07/01 – Whilst on patrol, we located a broken-down car in the live lane exiting the Hop Oast roundabout on the A24. Due to its location and our risk assessment, we called the police for a prompt response to avoid any collisions. They came out and the matter was resolved safely.

20/01 – Whilst on patrol, we became aware that one of the Parish Council's CCTV cameras for the Stakers Lane Skate Park had been moved reducing effective coverage. The matter was reported and adjustments made.

20/01 – We became aware of an outdoor tap owned by Horsham District Council which was leaking profusely, allowing water to run on to the pavement presenting a risk of ice in cold weather. It has been reported for repair.

26/01 – We became aware of debris from building works obstructing the footpath and reported the matter for consideration by West Sussex County Council who undertook a site visit, provided words of advice and attempted to improve the temporary situation.

27/01 – We undertook an area search for a dog seen running in the road around Marlpost Road, Southwater.

28/01 – We reported the failure of a previous repair to the pavement near Budgens to WSCC Highways.

30/01 – We supported a local resident following a non-injury road traffic collision to ensure they could safely get home, and one vehicle recovered following the exchange of details.

31/01 – We were approached by a resident in relation to broken glass all over the pavement near Southwater Junior Academy, and we attended and made the area safe.

- Horsham Family Hub (Blue):** Promotes general support for children and families. It notes '45 min slots' and 'Call to book a session FREE'. It also includes contact details and 'Early Help Service' branding.
- Horsham Family Hub Magic Carpet (Pink):** Focuses on the 'Magic Carpet' activity, where children can play on an interactive, touch-sensitive magic carpet with 100s of multi-sensory learning experiences. It lists hours (Monday, 9.30 AM - 4.30 PM) and 'Half hour slots available to book'. It features images of children playing and contact information.
- Horsham Family Hub Sensory Toy Library (Orange):** Promotes the 'Sensory Toy Library' where families can borrow up to 3 toys for 3 weeks for free. It lists hours (Monday, 9.30 AM - 4.30 PM) and 'A wide range of toys to support your child's learning.' It includes contact details and 'Early Help Service' branding.

Southwater Journey Support Group:

Established in November 2024, the Journey Support Group offers a dedicated space for Southwater parents and carers of children with SEN (Special Educational Needs). Meeting regularly at Beeson House in Lintot Square, the initiative is led by us, in partnership with Southwater Parish Council.

As of January 2026, the group is transitioning to a specialist-led format. While sessions will occur less frequently, they will now feature expert guests providing direct professional guidance and service information.
