Later on the same shift, they responded to an incident on the Evington beat for a welfare check on a vulnerable person. We're happy to report the individual was safe and well.

To finish the shift, officers carried out burglary patrols around Evington ward to help protect homes and deter crime.

PCSO Goodey has been out on the Evington and North Evington beats carrying out targeted patrols around key hotspots.

These patrols are part of our ongoing work to prevent crime and reassure the community.



PC Taylor from your local neighborhood policing team has been working closely with Midland Heart Housing to address ongoing reports of anti social behavior between neighbours on Rainworth Road.

Thanks to joint problem solving and positive engagement with everyone involved, an Acceptable Behavior Contract (ABC) has now been issued. Both parties have agreed to the conditions set out, helping to restore peace and prevent further issues.

This is a great example of how partnership working and early intervention can make a real difference in our communities.
