Project Work

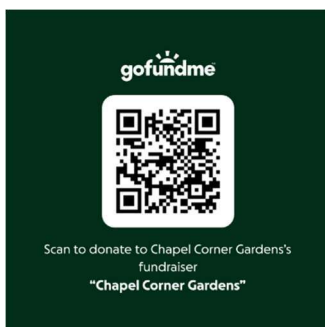


Chapel Corner Gardens – Trinity United Reformed Church

The Youth Boxing Programme is currently on its summer recess. During this period, we are reviewing the programme and exploring new ways to increase participation, with a particular focus on engaging the incoming Year 7 cohort and attracting young people from the wider community. As the club is open to all, this provides an excellent opportunity to broaden its reach and ensure the programme continues to grow and benefit more young people when sessions resume.

Youth Club @ The Depot

The last session of the term brought back by popular demand, a cooking session. The young people enjoyed cooking and eating their custom-made tortilla pizzas.

Similar to the boxing programme, the youth club is currently taking a seasonal break. However, it has been highly successful, with strong attendance clearly demonstrating the demand for this type of provision within the community. Discussions also focused on the rewarding aspects of the role, including building relationships within the community, supporting vulnerable residents, and contributing to safer neighbourhoods.

By working collaboratively with The Weald School, we were able to provide students with valuable insight into career opportunities within the community safety sector, while strengthening our engagement with local young people and supporting the school's wider careers education programme. Incident near the Weald School

Following a report to The Weald School of an individual exposing himself and committing an indecent act in the presence of a pupil, the Neighbourhood Warden Service was requested to provide support in managing community concerns and enhancing pupil safety.

We attended the area during school closing time on the same afternoon and worked closely alongside school staff to provide a visible and reassuring presence.

In partnership with The Weald School, we continued regular patrols throughout the remainder of the week and until the end of term.

This collaborative approach helped provide reassurance to pupils, parents, and staff, while maintaining a safe environment around the school during key arrival and departure times.

The proactive partnership working between the school and the Neighbourhood Warden Service, demonstrated a coordinated response focused on safeguarding young people and promoting community confidence.

Drunk male at the GP Surgery

After receiving a message that there was a drunk male outside the Billingshurst Surgery on Wednesday 1st July we attended and spoke with staff. The male had left prior to our arrival, but we conducted patrols in the area and picked up empty beer bottles nearby.

Other work in the community

This month we have also supported an older couple who were having issues with their broadband due to the digital switch over and helped them install their new router. We have searched for a missing resident with dementia, located them and returned them home to safety.

We have met with residents and given support and advice regarding neighbour issues.

We have also continued to liaise with our colleagues in licensing regarding the illegal trading by an ice cream vendor mentioned in our previous reports.

Parking

We have continued to speak with parents & carers outside Billingshurst Primary Academy regarding safe parking and being respectful to residents in Carpenters and Cleve Way. We are still seeing too many vehicles parked on pavements and double yellow lines. We have also met with two of Horsham District Council's Civil Enforcement Officers at the location.

Whilst there we have photographed the faded double yellow lines opposite the school and reported these to West Sussex County Council's Highways Department, and we hope these will be added to their re-painting schedule soon.



Fly Tipping & Litter

We've also reported a dumped trailer full of rubbish and over grown brambles at the Jengers Mead Garages to the landowners. Also, whilst it is lovely to see so many people donating unwanted clothes and shoes to charity, we had to contact the charity that has a collection station at Jubilee Fields to come and empty it as so much had been left surrounding it that it had become an unsightly trip hazard.



Anti-Social Behaviour/Damage



Disappointingly there has been an increase in anti-social behaviour at Station Road Gardens with offensive graffiti carved into the picnic tables and wood being removed from the compost heap areas and thrown into the multi-use games court and flower beds. We are working to identify those that are responsible. It is a shame that a minority have caused vandalism and are ruining such a wonderful community facility.

Based within the community, your Neighbourhood Wardens work alongside partner agencies to improve the quality of life for everyone and promote community cohesion and resilience. The Wardens undertake a number of activities, ranging from enforcement to community development.

Neighbourhood Wardens can help the community in the following ways:

- Meet the needs of the community and improve the quality of life for the residents, through engagement, promotion and support.
- Develop projects that benefit the local residents, to tackle community safety issues and promote inclusivity.
- Promote community cohesion, resilience and solidarity to encourage and empower communities to resolve issues.
- Support vulnerable members of the community with activities, advice, welfare checks and signposting.
- Engage with residents daily to get to know their local community and become a trusted friend to offer advice and guidance.
- Offer education and advice when required, before taking enforcement action.
- Contribute to the delivery of the Community Safety Partnership plan by working with other agencies.
- Provide a highly visible and reassuring uniformed patrolling presence.
- Provide an effective eyes and ears service aimed at reducing the fear of crime and improving quality of life.
- Work alongside the Police and submit reports regarding drug use, criminal damage and anti-social behaviour.
