

Multi-Agency Day of Action – 5 March

Officers from the **Palmers Green, Highfield, Bowes, and Winchmore Hill Safer Neighbourhood Teams**, together with **NSL Parking Enforcement** and **LBE Community Safety Unit (CSU)**, took part in a joint **multi-agency day of action** in the **Palmers Green – Green Lanes / Aldermans Hill** area.

This operation was organised in direct response to **community concerns**, including:

- Anti-social behaviour (ASB)
- E-bike-related crime
- Reports of inappropriate and unwanted sexualised behaviour by males outside local cafés

The primary aim was to provide a **strong, visible presence** in the area, offer reassurance, and take **proportionate enforcement action** where necessary. All agencies involved remain committed to improving **safety, trust, and confidence** within the community.

Engagement With Local Businesses

Community Safety officers, supported by police, visited cafés along Aldermans Hill to discuss concerns about customers engaging in inappropriate behaviour towards passing females.

- Staff were reminded of their **responsibilities**,
- Potential **enforcement actions** were explained,
- **Safeguarding advice** was provided.

Outcomes of the Operation

The day of action produced several positive results:

- **4 Community Protection Warnings** (pavement obstruction)
- **1 immigration arrest**
- **3 stop & searches** (drug-related)
- **2 ASB reports**
- **12 parking tickets** issued by council enforcement

Community Impact

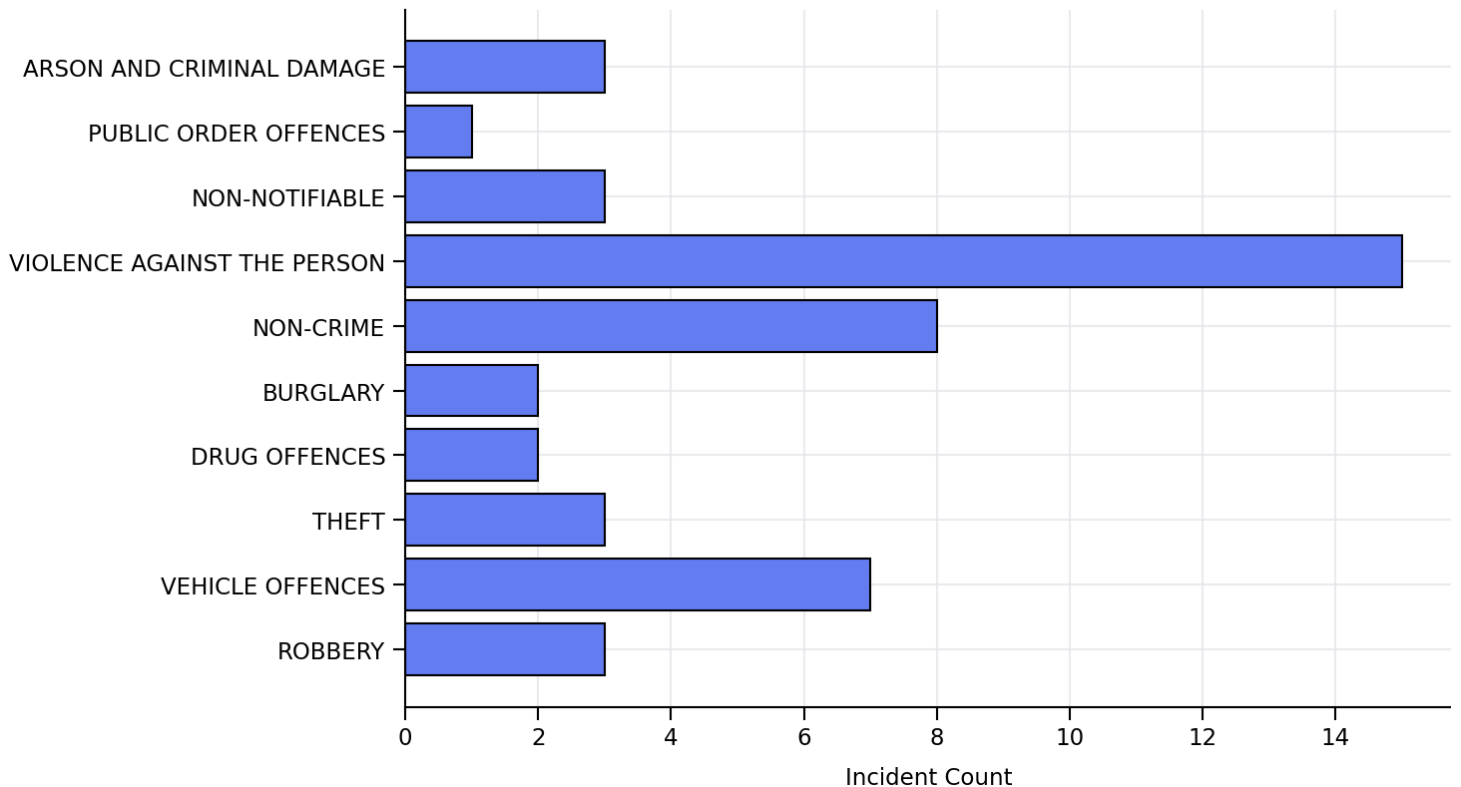

March 2026 – Crime Overview

During March 2026, local officers recorded a range of incidents across the area. The highest category was **Violence Against the Person**, with **15 reports**, followed by **Non-Crime incidents** at **8** and **Vehicle Offences** at **7**.

Other recorded offences included **Robbery (3)**, **Theft (3)**, **Arson & Criminal Damage (3)**, **Non-Notifiable offences (3)**, **Burglary (2)**, **Drug Offences (2)**, and **1 Public Order offence**.

Overall, the data reflects a **steady mix of crime types**, with violent incidents continuing to represent the largest portion of demand for the month.

March 2026 – Local Crime Summary

Burglary – Residential

The Fairway – 5 March

Police were alerted at **16:37 hrs** when a SimpliSafe home alarm notified the homeowner's son of suspicious activity.

Officers attended and found:

- Rear door forced/damaged
- An **untidy search** inside the property

Two suspects were described as **white males**, masked, wearing black/grey clothing; one wore a beanie hat. No suspects were located.

Attempted Burglary

The Fairway – 25 March

Two males were seen removing **kitchen taps and metal piping** from a rear garden.

- One climbed over the fence and passed items to the second male
- Items were loaded into a **white van**
- One suspect entered the shed but fled when disturbed

Both suspects left in the van.

Theft from Motor Vehicle

Coniscliffe Road – 26 March

A **catalytic converter** was stolen from a vehicle.

Theft of Motor Vehicle

The Fairway – 1 March

Two males broke into a vehicle without the keys and drove it away. The vehicle, a **black Lexus NX**, was later recovered.

Ulster Gardens – 7 March

A **grey Mitsubishi** was stolen overnight from a driveway.

The Fairway – 9 March

A **grey Nissan Juke** was stolen overnight.

Briar Close – 9 March

A **grey Nissan Juke** was stolen overnight and later recovered.

The Larches – 17 March

A **black Mitsubishi Outlander** was stolen from a driveway and reported the next day.

Land Firs Farm Playing Fields, Firs Lane – 11 March

A **white Volkswagen** was stolen from the car park.
Reported on 26 March. The vehicle was tracked and recovered with no damage.

Robbery

Munster Gardens – 8 March

Suspects entered the victim's room, restrained and assaulted him, stole cash, and threw his belongings outside before removing him from the address.

Attempted Robbery – Underpass at Great Cambridge Roundabout – 17 March

Two masked young males approached the victim and implied they had a knife. The victim, unsure of what was being demanded, walked away and was not followed.

Barrowell Green – 27 March

A 13-year-old was approached by a male on an e-scooter who showed a knife in his waistband. The victim felt pressured to hand over his property.

Other Theft

The Fairway – 23 March

A phone was stolen from a delivery parcel; the parcel arrived **empty**.

Firs Lane – 30 March

Between **18:00–18:10 hrs**, an unknown suspect stole a parcel from the victim's doorstep.

Theft Person

Barrowell Green – 21 March

The victim reported concerns that his ex-partner may have kept money he previously entrusted to her. Enquiries are ongoing.

Criminal Damage

Carpenter Gardens – 15 March

A glass panel in a front door was found broken. No suspects were seen.

Access Road to Tatum Recreation Ground – 21 March

Around **10:32 hrs**, a suspect threw gravel and sand at a vehicle, causing scratches and paint damage. The incident occurred near the pond off Hedge Lane.

Rayleigh Road – 31 March

At **20:00 hrs**, an unknown suspect caused puncture damage to the tyres of the victim's vehicle.

Drugs

Possession of Cannabis – 5 March (N9 9UJ)

During a vehicle stop, officers located a small amount of cannabis on the front seat passenger. A further small quantity was found in the passenger footwell area of the vehicle. The male admitted that both amounts belonged to him. A Penalty Cannabis Warning (PCR) will be issued.

Possession of Cannabis – 25 March (Hedge Lane)

A male was found in possession of cannabis following a Section 23 search. Appropriate action was taken at the scene.



VEHICLE SECURITY

- Always lock your vehicle when unattended
- Consider using steering locks or other deterrents
- Park in well-lit and secure areas



PROTECTING YOUR HOME

- Ensure doors and windows are locked
- install a visible security system or alarm
- Use timers for lights when you are out



PERSONAL SAFETY

- Keep your phone and valuables out of sight

SAFEGUARDING YOUR VALUABLES

- Be vigilant in crowded areas or on public transport
- Avoid displaying valuable items in public

- EXPIRY 31**
- PHOTO**
A larger photo on the front for identification
- NAME, RANK AND WARRANT NUMBER**
Every warrant number is unique to the officer
- Warrant No 123456**
- HOLOGRAM**
Displayed on the front
