What matters to you

From information collated from local surveys, beat knowledge, intelligence and reports to Leicestershire Police, the following areas have been highlighted as priorities within the community:

- **Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)**

You said: Anti-social behaviour in the area of Wigston Lane.

We did: We have noticed a reduction in reports for Anti-Social Behaviour in the Montrose Road South area, this is really positive and shows our patrols and warnings do work!

The team, including officer 4588 Singh, arrested a male for public order on Wigston Lane earlier this month. This was another positive result and helps work towards making the area a safer place for the community.

- **Priority 2: Drugs**

You said: Drug dealing in various locations across Aylestone

We did: As a team we work hard to gather intelligence so we can start putting a stop to drug use and dealing in the area. Due to our patrols and knowing who our people of interest are, we have had multiple stop searches around the Aylestone area and have been able to develop intelligence from this.

- **Priority 3: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)**

You said: Anti-Social behaviour in the area of Montrose Road South

We did: Conducted further patrols after the warnings were issued. This has significantly reduced the Anti-Social Behaviour in the area and we have now received less reports of this issue. We have conducted a patch walk with the council on the open space area of Montrose Road South, this has enabled us to tidy up the park and remove any hotspots for crime and Anti-Social Behaviour.

Collaboration is one of our greatest strengths

PCSO Kayleigh and the council park ranger for the area organised a patch walk in the Montrose Road South Open Space to start to clear up the park! This park was becoming a hotspot for ASB and large unsafe dens were being built in the middle of the park which were becoming a safety hazard.

We do not want to ruin the fun for our younger community, but equally we need to make it safe for all whilst trying to deter further crime/ASB. This was a success and the litter and fly-tipping was also cleared. Thank you again to our park rangers and partner agencies!
