Introduction

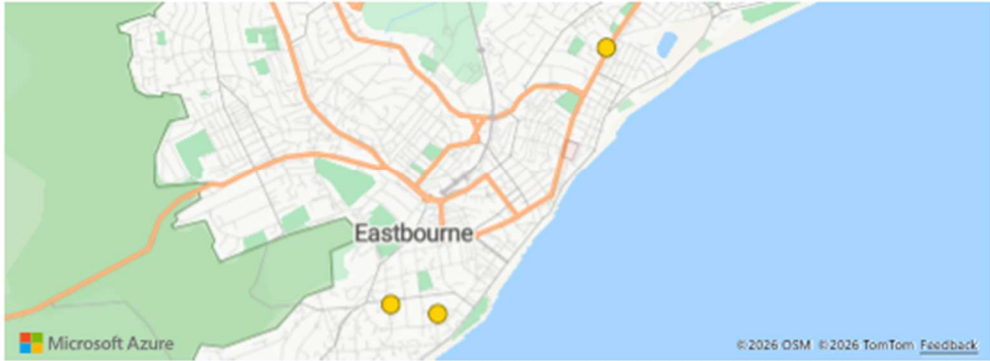

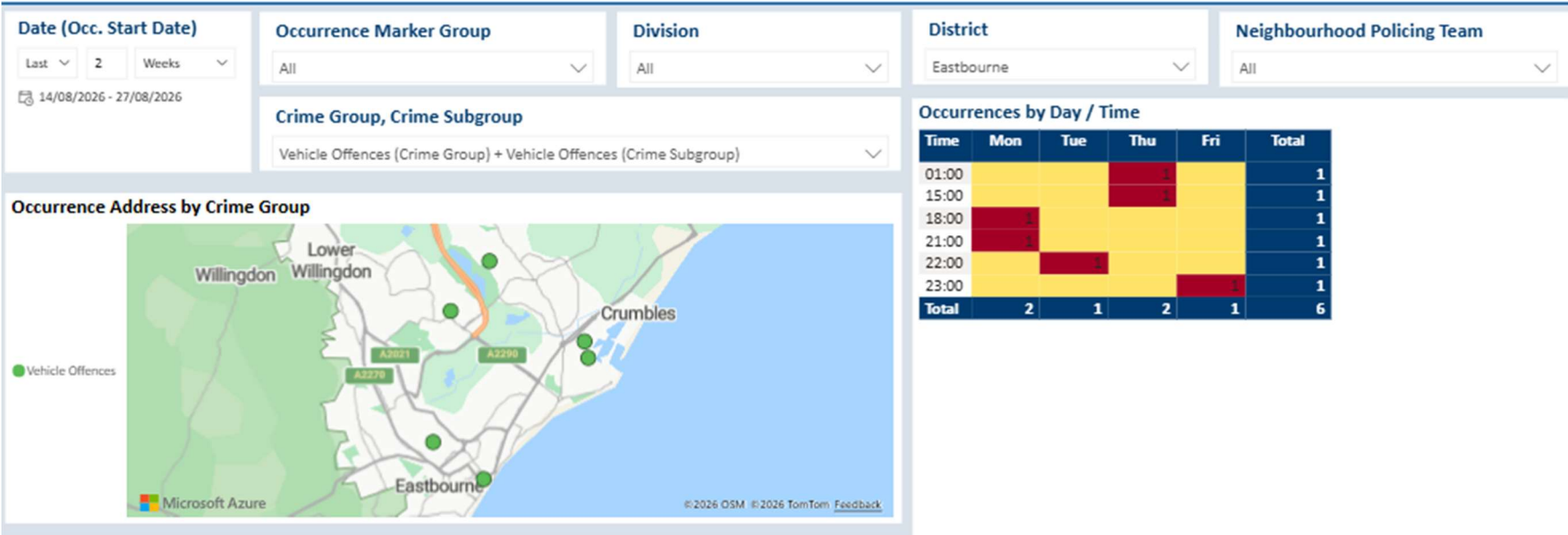
