What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will priorities the following from March 2025.

Priority 1: ASB. You said: You have concerns around antisocial behavior across the village. We will continue to try and disrupt this type of behavior and use the ASB incremental approach to deter offenders.

Priority 2: Speeding. You said: You are concerned about vehicles speeding in the villages. We will continue to monitor and enforce speed across several sites in the village.

Priority 3: Burglaries. We aim to work with the relevant authorities to reduce the burglaries across the village and to try and reduce the number of reported thefts from the recycling centre. Visiting victims and offering crime prevention advice.

January

I would like to start by welcoming our new Beat Sergeant, Chris Osborn, who has recently joined the neighbourhood policing team. Sergeant Osborn will be working closely with officers and partners to address local concerns and continue supporting the community.

Priority 1: The beat team aim to tackle different elements of ASB in Mountsorrel

High-visibility patrols have been carried out at local ASB hotspots, including, The Memorial Centre, The Green, Halstead Road and Gilliver Drive.

These patrols are ongoing to provide reassurance and deter further incidents.

We also received an isolated report of three individuals riding motorbikes in an anti-social manner. Officers attended and spoke with those involved, and the matter was resolved at the time.

If you witness any similar behavior or ongoing ASB, please report it via 101 so it can be dealt with promptly.

Priority 2: The beat team aim to target reports of speeding in Mountsorrel.

Speed Ops

Following a concern raised by a local resident, officers conducted speed checks on Walton Way. During the checks, 77 vehicles were monitored, all of which were travelling within the legal speed limit, with most recorded between 20–25 mph. This is encouraging and shows good compliance from motorists.

We will continue to respond to speeding concerns where they are raised and carry out checks where appropriate.

Priority 3: Burglaries

We are pleased to report that there have been no reported burglaries in the area over the past fourteen days. We would like to thank residents for remaining vigilant and continuing to report anything suspicious. Preventative measures and community awareness continue to play a key role in keeping neighborhoods safe.
