What Matters to You?

Evington Beat Priorities (issued 1st July 2025)

- Reports from the public concerning road safety. Including inconsiderate parking, excessive speeding and general non compliance with road traffic legislation amongst other complaints concerning anti social behaviour with vehicles.
- Operation Groove Our local policing operation to prevent a rise in crime and anti social behaviour during the lighter summer months.
- Commercial Theft and Shoplifting

Sergeant Hall took the opportunity to hit the streets, conducting patrols across the area. As the Community Commander overseeing recent Ganesh celebrations, he was out and about ensuring everything ran smoothly and safely. His evening included: Briefing both the neighbourhood late shift and the dedicated Ganesh patrol teams, engaging with the community to support safe and lawful celebration. Completing Operation Groove patrols across Shaykh Adam Square, Sparrow Park, Humberstone Park, and Rally Bank. Attending a road traffic collision while on foot patrol, as well as assisting two males who had collapsed due to injury and intoxication.





PCSO Cook held her beat surgery at St Barnabas Library and spoke with local residents about issues affecting our community. One resident raised concerns about possible

drug dealing, street drinking, and littering. PCSO Cook signposted them to the Love Leicester app to report litter directly to the council — a quick and easy way to help keep our streets clean! The Police will be developing the information shared about drug activity and will increase patrols in the area to monitor street drinking and help deter anti-social behaviour. She also received a neighbour dispute referral from Cllr Modhwadia where PCSO Cook will be following up with the complainant to gather full details and offer support.

PC Darbar and PC Makda visited Leicestershire Golf Club in Evington following reports of anti-social behaviour. Concerns included: people trespassing onto the golf course, causing damage to the grounds and late-night use of the car park for disruptive activities. Officers will be keeping a close eye on the area with regular patrols to address any ongoing issues and speak with those involved. If you see or hear anything suspicious, report it via 101 or online.







PC Makda, PCSO Meerun and our Lead Volunteer Richard were at the Evington-Village Fete, an event we're proud to be invited to every year. Neighbourhood Policing is built on strong community connections. Events like this give people the chance to speak directly with local officers, ask questions, and learn more about the work we do — all in a relaxed and friendly setting.
