What Matters to You

With data provided by our local community we have decided on our beat priorities.

- **Priority 1** Problem management plan around general disorder on Bonney Road. This involves youths illegal use of motorbikes and Anti-Social Behaviour around the area caused by the same youths
- **Priority 2** Anti-Social Behaviour and damage offences are occurring in the vicinity of the 'Burns' flats which is affecting the daily lives of the residents.
- **Priority 3** Repeated concerns have been raised around Road Safety across the ward. This was also highlighted at the Ward meeting on 16th April 2024. Serious injury incidents have previously occurred and near misses continue to occur across the Ward including outside primary schools.

Anti-Social Behaviour at the 'Burns' Flats

The work that the Beat team have done with the Leicester City Council 'Community Safety Team' have continued to tackle reports of criminal damage and Anti social behaviour. In conjunction with the Community Safety Team, Leicester City Council Housing team Pc 2885 Flavill, Pc 367 Powell and Pc 406 Gandwan have made visits during the month to those involved to remind them of the conditions of their contract conditions and we continue to take robust action against offenders.



Tackling Nuisance Motorbikes/E-scooters

Motorbikes / ASB - Western Ward officers Pc 367 Powell and Pc 2885 Flavill dealt with a local youth for numerous offences relating to theft of motorbikes and traffic offences.

Pc 2885 Flavill with our partner agency Leicester City Council CRASBU team visited an address on Bonney Rd where residents were issued with an Acceptable Behaviour Contract and are being monitored.
