#### **THE WARD PRIORITIES:**

The safer neighbourhood team will work towards three ward priorities. The first priority will be set by the SNT and will be violence related. Ward panel members will set a minimum of two local ward priorities.

# EALING COMMON WARD PRIORITIES

- 1)To reduce violent related offences in known areas of the ward particularly around Warwick Road and south Ealing Road, particularly violence and VAWG related offences.
- 2)Violence and related drug activity around south Ealing Road and the Trees Estate.
- 3)Residential burglary offenses in Warwick Road and south Ealing Road.

## JANUARY - A good start to the Year, First Ward Panel Meeting, Burglary suspect ARRESTED and Stolen Vehicles recovered and returned.

SNT Officers have attended there Cycling training and have now completed their course allowing us to cover more of the Ward by cycling, The training came in handy when attending an emergency call that allowed us to attend in less than 2 minutes which led to an arrest of a Burglary suspect. A cuppa with a copper a successful coffee meeting set in a relaxed environment discussing local ward concerns leading to intelligence reports being made. Multiple phone snatches have occurred in recent months but with tracking devices we have recovered mobile phones by attending addresses and recovering the phones. A Machete taking off the streets off Ealing common as SNT officers attended a common assault.

## APRIL - Bike Marking event, Safer steps VAWG Park run and Stolen Vehicles.

Our 2<sup>nd</sup> Bike Marking event of the year has deterred crime by SNT officers marking up your bicycles, Come on down to our next event. Safer Steps 5K Park run in Walpole Park in aid of supporting violence against woman and girls (VAWG) was a huge success. Motor Vehicle crime has always been priority on the ward but with SNT officers we have located stolen vehicles and returned to their owners.





# MAY - Ward Panel and Stolen Vehicles...

A successful <u>Ward Panel Meeting</u> with Members of parliament, local councillors and residents who attended and have highlighted drug hotspots and ASB areas. Regular patrols on foot and cycle have led to multiple <u>stolen vehicles</u> found in hidden hotspots around the common leading to being seized and towed.

# JUNE - Cannabis Factory... Busted

In the recent couple of months SNT officers have been given intelligence on a potential <u>Cannabis factory</u> on the Ealing common ward, With the intelligence built we forced entry into the property with one male fleeing the scene, with help with our Police dog Yolo and Rebel we captured the suspect and arrested him. We have seized over <u>350 Cannabis Plants</u> in 5 rooms across the property.
