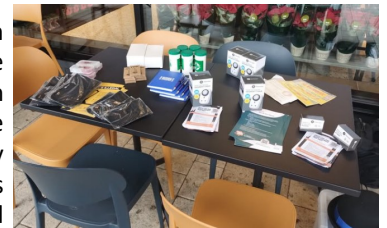
News

Officers attended a beat surgery in Lubbethorpe outside Sainsburys and Ashmore Grange care home. There have been a number of reports of theft at Sainsburys over the last few weeks and this is being investigated. We have been supporting staff and patrolling the area. We have also been at Primark holding a beat surgery, giving away crime prevention items and advice to busy shoppers getting their gifts for Christmas.

PC Jen and PC Fraser conducted arrest attempts for a male Wanted on Warrant in Enderby, during their shift together they investigated two neighbour disputes where words of advice were given; they dealt with a road rage incident; assisted a man with his broken down vehicle on Narborough Road South; completed intelligence and crime enquiries, and finally worked with our partner agencies to obtain an injunction for a problem person on the beat. Busy, Busy, Busy!!!!

Detectives are appealing for information after five people were injured following a two-car collision in Enderby on the evening of Saturday 6 December 2025. Police were called at 6.11pm by East Midlands Ambulance Service who were in attendance at the scene on Beggars Lane, near to the junction with Desford Road. The collision involved a green Volkswagen Polo and a white Mercedes car. Five adults were taken to hospital with injuries following the incident. Two passengers of the Polo, and a passenger of the Mercedes, all remained in hospital having sustained serious injuries. The driver of the Mercedes was taken to hospital but has since been discharged. The driver of the Polo – a 30-year-old man from Leicester – was arrested on suspicion of causing serious injury by dangerous driving in connection with the incident. He has been released on Police bail. An investigation by the force's Serious Collision Investigation Unit remains ongoing: anyone who saw the incident, who saw either of the vehicles travelling beforehand, or who has relevant dashcam is urged to contact Leicestershire Police.
