Policing Uplift for Brixton Town Centre

On 31st July, the Metropolitan Police announced a boost in officers dedicated to town centres. Deputy Commissioner Matt Jukes joined our Brixton Town Centre team on patrol, meeting with local businesses and residents. For Brixton, this uplift means growing from our current strength of 1 Sergeant and 8 Constables to 4 Sergeants and 24 Constables. While it will take time to reach the full numbers, we're pleased to confirm that from September we will see an immediate increase of 1 Sergeant and 7 Constables.

Retail Crime Day of Action

On Friday 8th August, local police teamed up with partners to focus on retail crime within the Town Centre. Partners including Lambeth Council, Brixton BID and the Safer Business Network worked with us to patrol, reassaure the public and arrest those suspected of retail crime. This resulted in 10 arrest We were joined by senior officers and a Home Office official, allowing our officers and partners to discuss the challenges faced in the Town Centre.



Live Facial Recognition

On Tuesday 12th August, we held a Live Facial Recognition (LFR) in Brixton. This was the first time that the technology had been used in Brixton. The operation saw a total of 17 people arrested, all of whom were wanted either by the police or courts. This is one of the options available to us to keep Brixton safe.



Positive Policing Outcomes

Three of Brixton's most prolific shoplifters have recently been arrested, charged and remanded by local officers. These shoplifters were heavily targeting many shops within the Town Centre with Boots and Holland & Barrett being repeat targets. Working with store staff and the Brixton BID, we are now applying to the courts for Criminal Behaviour Orders (CBOs) for all three offenders.

Current Priorities and Initiatives

- Safer Streets Summer Plan High visibility patrols across Brixton Town Centre with a focus on reducing ASB and violent crime.
- Retail Crime Operations Dedicated patrols focusing on those offenders targeting businesses.
- **Problem-Solving Partnership Work** Working with the Local Authority and local partners to address the sale of counterfeit and stolen goods.
