#YouSaidWeDid - What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following;

Priority 1: Anti-social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park and Cort Crescent

You said: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) in and around Braunstone Park and Cort Crescent has again been identified as a priority concern from the community and now with the lighter nights arriving we will continue to target and focus on this area of concern.

We DID! Since December 2024 we have had a Problem Management Plan (PMP) in place relating to the Anti-Social Behaviour around the Cort Crescent area and in particular items being thrown at passing vehicles. During 2025 we have increased our hotspot patrols in the vicinity. Again in April we have increased them further especially over the Easter Break and whilst there is still ASB in the park there have been no identified instances with throwing items at cars. This is again welcome news that there is a marked reduction and motorists are not being targeted by those responsible. We will continue to patrol this area and by working with our partners anyone identified will be held accountable.

Priority 2: Road Safety

You Said: From Community Surveys and Feedback on Neighbourhood Link, Road Safety has been highlighted to be a local concern for our Beat. As such we will continue to keep this as a priority and Speeding vehicles has been identified as being one of the main points of concern within the community.

We DID! During April 2025 we have continued to focus on Road Safety as a priority as YOU SAID this was an issue. During this month there have been 3 vehicles seized from our Beat area alone for NO TAX using powers provided to the Police under DVLA guidance. There were numerous Road Traffic Collisions this past month and some of them did incur some slight injury. Those matters are being investigated and reports submitted for consideration of either Advice via Education or Prosecution if deemed suitable in those instances. Of note 11 vehicles have been seized in April alone for No Licence or Insurance. This is a high figure that just shows how many people drive on the roads without the correct documentation. This will be dealt with and those drivers not only face hefty fines to have the vehicles back if they can provide the required documents, but will also be prosecuted by the courts in due course.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour (Drug related)

You Said: From the Surveys on Neighbourhood Link you have told us that drug dealing and usage at addresses across the Braunstone and Rowley Fields area is your top concern and problem that you want us to keep focus on - so we are!

We DID! As promised we have carried on with targeting those people or addresses that are concerned in the use or supply of illegal drugs. 3 Section 8 PACE Warrants have been executed at addresses on Imperial Avenue, Winstanley Drive and Sweetbriar Road this month and those arrested have been released pending further enquiries into those cases.

Enforcement was also conducted at an address on Nuttfield Road where a Cannabis Factory was identified and safely dismantled. An active investigation is underway around this address.

An eviction of a tenant on Gaskell Walk has taken place following many months of court hearings and appeals all due to this address being involved in the use and supply of Drugs. This should be a reminder to all tenants or occupiers of addresses that the Police, Landlords and other partners will work together to enforce where it is required.

April has proved to be yet another very busy month for the local beat team;

- A warrant has been executed at an address on Nutfield Road. This led to the discovery of a cannabis grow. With great team work from all officers on the beat, the grow was destroyed and the investigation continues.
- A wanted male was spotted by PCSOs Beth + Julie. He was outstanding for multiple high value shop thefts. With assistance from Beaumont Leys PCs, the male was quickly detained and conveyed to custody.
- PCs Chelsea, George and SGT Graeme attended an address on the beat area to conduct an urgent search warrant. They were assisted by colleagues from the Beaumont Ward, CID and the City Neighbourhood Priority Team. A male was arrested for a serious assault, and a large quantity of suspected Class A drugs were located.
- PCs George and Chelsea located and arrested a male who was wanted for a burglary.
- PCSOs have carried out neighbourhood consultations in the area of Hamelin Road, Bennett Walk, Blackmore Drive and Gaskell Walk where there have been concerns about drug dealing. If you weren't around but want to share your concerns, please feel free to message us using Neighbourhood Link.
- PCs and PCSOs from the beat team—along with SGT Graeme—assisted colleagues from Leicester City Council with the eviction of tenants from a problem address associated with drug use and anti-social behaviour.
