#YouSaid - What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following in January 2025.

Priority 1: Burglary

You said: Issues raised relate to general burglaries within the area of Wigston.

What we are going to do: Officers have been conducting visits and patrols in relation to burglaries across the Wigston area. This has included holding beat meetings with residents to discuss the ways in which they can keep their property safe as well their property.

Priority 2: Road Safety issues

You Said: Local concerns have been raised about speeding and the safety on the roads.

What we are going to do: Targeted work at in the keys areas that are reported to us. Officers have been conducting speed checks around the West Avenue area and Little Hill area. If there are any other areas that you would like us to target then please let us know.

Priority 3: Criminal Damage.

You Said: Concerns raised relating to criminal damage in the area of Wigston.

What we are going to do: Support residents on an individual basis where the complaints have been made. If there are any further areas that you would like us to tackle then make contact so we can prioritise patrols and outcomes for you.

#WeDid - What we are doing

For much of January, crime figures have been good. Officers have been attending reports of vulnerable people. We have supported local businesses in crime prevention and raising awareness PCSO's as been visiting the stores on Bell Street and Leicester Road. We have responded as and when we receive complaints regarding parking and speeding, dealing with as appropriate, particularly around the schools in Primary Schools in Wigston. We have visited Wigston Academy and spoken with youths that were identified to be displaying anti-social behaviour. This includes home visits, conversations with parents/children and issuing letters. Officers have seized vehicles that were on the road and displayed as not having Tax, MOT and insurance. Please ensure that you are checking that all documentation is in order with your vehicle.

- Busy month for community engagements where officers all held a beat surgery at Menphys café, Willow Park, Café Bocca and Stage service station. Officers have also attended Primary schools and Wigston Academy to talk with students about personal safety and online safety.
- We have been dealing with local issues such as welfare checks on vulnerable elderly people.
- Ongoing patrols in areas of concerns to identify those involved and reduce incidents.
- Plans made for the upcoming months with events, beat surgery's and crime prevention support for the residents of Wigston.
- Officers have and are currently in talks with those who are showing signs of anti-social behaviour within the area of Wigston. Support for residents who have made complaints have been conducted and in some cases with the support of the council to implement outcomes.
 Officers have completed patrols to disrupt and challenge behaviour.
- Work ongoing with local schools where incidents of bullying traits of behaviour have been brought to our attention and officers are working closely to rectify this.
- We have also been helping in regarding to other issues that come to Police such as neighbour disputes, events that impact and cause community concerns, gaining intelligence regarding criminal activity and addressing community safety concerns.
- Officers have been assisting with vehicles that have been stranded and or damaged with the recent flooding that we had.
