Hate Crime Awareness Week - 11th-18th

There is no place for hate in Sussex. Our message is very clear - hate crime will never be tolerated.

Hate crime is when someone is targeted due to their disability, race, religion, sexual orientation, transgender identity or any perceived difference.

Hate crime harms victims and our communities, and the impact it causes cannot be underestimated. During the week, our NPT were out visiting schools and universities, as well as shopping centres, talking to people about what constitutes a hate crime, the impact it can have on victims and the wider community, as well as advising people how they can report.

In addition to the visits, our officers also conducted foot patrols across the city. As always, this is just a small snapshot of the work that occurred over the week.

Although Hate Crime Awareness Week is over, our work continues.

Every single report matters – if you or someone you know has been impacted by hate crime, please tell us so we can build a picture of what is happening in our communities and take action.

Men jailed for operating drugs line in Sussex

Court Result

Two men who supplied drugs in Brighton and Bognor have been sentenced.

Officers from Sussex Police's Community Investigation Team, working in partnership with the Metropolitan Police, identified a phone line advertising drugs.

Evidence from phones seized from both men showed their links to operating the 'Pokey' line by sending bulk advertising messages and promotional offers.

A man has pleaded guilty after he uploaded a video to social media filming himself spray-painting Islamophobic and homophobic comments around Brighton.


On September 18, the video was identified, linking to graffiti sprayed on a wall at Old Steine on September 9.

His handwriting was also linked to further similar graffiti committed on September 10 and 11 in St James's Street and New Road.

Business burglaries prevention




You may have invested a great deal of time, energy and money in your business premises, but burglars make it their business to break in.

Make sure your CCTV is operational, provides facial recognition as well as good quality images and covers any vulnerable areas. 24-hour digital CCTV is also highly recommended.



Identify areas that may be vulnerable to forced entry and have them made more secure.

Make sure there is sufficient lighting around the premises, especially loading areas.

Consider moving high-value goods away from display windows overnight.
