## **Statistics for Eastry**

94 calls to Eastry from 1<sup>st</sup> January to the 31<sup>st</sup> January 2026.

### **Incidents of note:**

05/01/2026 – Gore Lane, Eastry.

Report of a fire at a property. Fire brigade in attendance and confirmed to be deliberate ignition. Suspect was arrested and enquires are still ongoing.

Numerous calls over the month of January to building site, Mill Lane, Eastry.

Reports from remote security of persons seen on building site. Patrols have attended each time. On one occasion a vehicle was seen leaving the site, and two persons stopped, detained and arrested. Additional security measures have been implemented to make the perimeter more secure.

Numerous calls regarding nuisance vehicles racing at Betteshanger Road, Betteshanger and A256 at Tilmanstone over the weekends of the 16<sup>th</sup> January and 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2026. Patrols were sent to the locations and remained in the area to deter anti-social and criminal behaviour.

### **Road Safety Operation in Sandwich**

On 14<sup>th</sup> January 2026, officers from Dover Neighbourhood Team were joined by officers from the Road Safety Unit (RSU) and the Driver and Vehicle Standards Agency (DVSA) on a joint traffic operation along the A256 around Sandwich. The purpose of the operation was to proactively target motorists who are not adhering to the road traffic act. The day resulted in:

- 21 x Traffic Offence Report's for multiple offences including, No Insurance, driving otherwise in accordance, no MOT, Bald tyres, No seat belt and mobile phone
- 7 x vehicle seizures for no insurance and no tax
- 5 x overweight prohibitions and £900 of fixed penalties
- 1 x no operator's licence
- 1 x tachograph not fitted
- 2 x Immediate load security encounters with £100 fixed penalties issued
- 3 x Immediate dangerous condition prohibition issued
- 1 x Delayed prohibition
- 7 x Inspection notices issued
- 1 x Vehicle immobilised £80
