Alcester Police SNTs. Latest Weekly Report. Sunday 16th August 2026

Based at Alcester Police Station, The Safer Neighbourhood team's primary roles are around crime prevention, problem solving both long standing or emerging issues of community concern and community engagement. We are supported at Alcester by colleagues from Patrol teams whose role is to respond to incidents and investigate crimes that occur in the area 24/7. The SNT is supervised by Inspector Jake Kibblewhite who leads on Neighbourhood Policing for Stratford District and Sgt Ebbs who also oversees neighbourhood Policing in the Shipston on Stour area. The Alcester SNT currently consists of Police officers and Police Community Support Officers, and our contact details are shown above.

Suspicious Circumstances. Area of New Inn Cottages, Salford Road. Two males on two motorbikes. They were trying to pull off the number plate of one of the bikes. Both were wearing helmets - one was red. They eventually rode off Around 7pm Monday 10th August. 0357 10/08/2026

COUGHTON HILL A435

Suspicious Circumstances. A435 Studley / Coughton. Two males wearing balaclavas riding two motorcycles. The riders had a bright blue tracksuit and a black tracksuit. One of the bikes was missing a registration plate. 5.15pm Monday 10th August. 0332 10/08/2026

SAMBOURNE

Suspicious Circumstances. Oak Tree Lane. Male seen acting suspiciously around premises. 4.10am Saturday 15th August. 0159 15/08/2026

STUDLEY

Suspicious Circumstances. Redditch Road. Two white males seen acting suspiciously near to works van. They were challenged and ran off towards the village centre. 1.40am Thursday 13th August. 0033 13/08/2026

ASB. High Street. Youngsters climbing onto walls and then onto roofs of buildings. Police attended and have found and spoken with the youths. 11pm Tuesday 11th August. 0472 11/08/2026

WELFORD

Suspicious Circumstances. Extended area of the Cemetery, Headland Road. White Male, aged in his 50's, seen acting suspiciously in the area. No offences disclosed at the time. About 9am Saturday 8th August. 0317 12/08/2026

CLIFFORD CHAMBERS

Vehicle Crime. Campden Road. Black Land Rover Defender stolen without key. 11.40pm Tuesday 11th August. 0481 11/08/2026

HENLEY

Suspicious Circumstances. Arden Road. Two males with face coverings seen walking around outside of premises. It looked like they had packs on their front and back. Around 1.30am Saturday 15th August. 0054 15/08/2026

Robbery. Shop, High Street. Drunk male has entered the shop on a couple of occasions and has threatened staff before stealing various items. Incident 11/08/2026 12 middays. 0477 14/08/2026

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ULLENHALL

Suspicious Circumstances / Potential Fraud. Ullenhall Street. Member of the public wanting to sell car has been visited by two males who offered to buy the vehicle once they had given it a test drive / check over. It appears during this time they may have put oil over the engine and into the radiator which then gave the impression the engine was in a state of disrepair - subsequently they have offered to buy it at a considerably lower price. The males became very persuasive and eventually a lower price was agreed upon. Paperwork was handed over and some money was transferred. The vehicle was pushed onto the road and at some point, later in the day it was collected. Another vehicle was seen driving with it in convoy. At the time of this report, it is not known if the money that was transferred remains in the seller's account. Around 10pm Sunday 14th August. 0126 15/08/2026

What to do if you are a victim of fraud

If you have been a victim of fraud, there is a network of support and information available to you. Sometimes people choose not to report fraud or seek advice because they are embarrassed.

Remember that **fraud is a crime** and that fraudsters will constantly reinvent themselves to find new ways of tricking people. Anyone could be a victim.

First steps

The first thing you should do if you've been a victim of fraud is to contact Report Fraud. You can report a fraud via our [online fraud reporting tool](#), or by calling Report Fraud on **0300 123 2040**.

If there is a crime being committed right now or if you are in danger, you should call the police on 999.

If debit or credit cards, online banking or cheques are involved, your first step should be to contact your bank or credit card company.

Ongoing support

When you tell Report Fraud about your crime, you are given the option for your contact details to be passed on to [Victim Support](#), a national charity that helps those affected by crime. If you take up this option, you will then be contacted by someone from the charity and offered free and confidential emotional support and practical help.



Using the online reporting form – Warwickshire County Council

Warwickshire County Council Community Safety Team are members of the “Community Safety Partnership”, together with other agencies they work to address crime and safety concerns within your community. Anti-Social Behaviour caused by nuisance bikes is one such area we know accounts for a large proportion of ASB reports. If bikes are being used in a manner which causes alarm, distress or annoyance, Police can issue notices under Section 59 of the Police Reform Act or seize the bike.

Nuisance bikes, whether it be a Motorbike, E-Bike or Quad Bike are a cause of concern for several reasons; the noise that is created disturbs people in their homes, gardens and community, the riders often have no regard for other people’s safety on the public highway or byways, nor do they care about being road legal. You must explain to us in detail why they are causing alarm, distress or annoyance, this is very important information as the detail is needed for action to be taken using available legislation.

Once you complete a nuisance bike reporting form it will go directly to the Community Safety Team and be dealt with accordingly. The aim of this form is to gather as much information as possible to identify the offender/s involved. The details of the form will be shared with other members of the Community Safety Partnership where appropriate.

It is vital you include:

- Details of the bikes
- Descriptions of the riders
- Names of those involved.
- Addresses of where the bike/s are stored.

Over time, this information will help build up a picture of the issues within your community and partners can then take more appropriate and focused action. Direct action will only be taken once the rider, and/or address has been identified and enough supporting evidence has been obtained.

This form is only to be used to gather intelligence on offenders. To report incidents of ASB involving nuisance bikes please use 101 or by contacting your Local Authority.
