

# **Highway Safety – Parking Concerns**

# **Road Safety Patrol Update**

- Speed Enforcement Northwich Road: Highest speed recorded: 32 mph (within limit).
- Parking Patrol Weaverham High School: Double parking on Lime Avenue caused congestion. Traffic Management Officer will assess.

**Speed Enforcement – Norley Road, Cuddington:** Highest speed recorded: **33 mph**. Further checks planned.

#### **Community Safety:**

I met with Traffic Management Officer and CWAC Cllr Edwards to review parking and safe routes around Weaverham High School.

# Stay Safe Online - Avoid Scams

Criminals create fake websites and target social media, auction sites, and marketplaces. They also impersonate delivery companies to steal money and personal details.

# **Protect your accounts:**

Turn on 2-step verification (2SV). Shopping tips:

- Check if offers are genuine and read reviews.
- Never pay by bank transfer; use a credit card if possible.

Avoid saving card details; check out as a guest.

## **Delivery scams:**

Verify messages or calls directly via official websites or apps.

Do not click on unexpected links.

# **FRAUD warnings**



# Operation DELIVERING

Cheshire Constabulary are launching an operation to mitigate the risk of theft /robbery offences, being committed against drivers and couriers over the festive period.

The operation launches on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> December 2025 will run throughout the whole of December.

As part of the operation, delivery drivers are being urged to help play their part by following a number of simple steps to reduce the chances of falling foul of thieves.

#### The steps include -

- · Ensure your vehicle is in proper operating condition.
- If you spot a suspicious vehicle following you, do not exit the vehicle, keep doors locked, keep moving, and call the police.
- Agree a daily delivery plan with employers or, if independent, with a family member and check with them on a regular basis. If possible, when out delivering consider using alternative routes rather than always going the same way.
- · Ensure your mobile phone is fully charged.
- If something does not look or feel right, do not make the delivery. Call your employer and explain the circumstances.
- · Be aware of your surroundings and avoid areas that are not well lit.
- · Carry a torch to illuminate dark areas and walkways.
- · If you feel threatened, activate the panic alarm on your vehicle to draw attention to the situation.
- · Always lock your vehicle It would take a matter of seconds for a thief to get into your van and make off with something valuable
- If your vehicle has windows consider darkening them to prevent passers-by from seeing what's inside.
- · Install a 'Police follow this van' sticker on your vehicle to make officers aware of who you are.
- If you have a keyless van consider using a key blocking pouch to prevent other people from accessing your vehicle while you are handing over parcels
- Consider installing a tracker if the worst were to occur and your vehicle were to be stolen, a tracker would enable officers to quickly locate it.
