## #YouSaid - What matters to you

We have listened to your concerns and prioritised the following in December 2025:

### Priority 1: Parking concerns

- **You Said:** Parking concerns on Bennion Road during football training sessions. We have received multiple complaints from residents regarding dangerous, inconsiderate, and illegal parking in the vicinity of Bennion Road. These issues appear to be particularly prevalent during football training days and are causing significant disruption and safety concerns within the community.
- **Our Action:** On Saturday 18th January, PCSO 6527 Kurtis attended Bennion Road alongside Civil Enforcement Officers. The team engaged with a number of drivers regarding parking concerns in the area. During the operation, one Penalty Charge Notice was issued for dangerous parking, while the majority of vehicles were found to be parked legally. A multi-agency meeting is currently being planned to explore and agree on long-term solutions to the ongoing parking issues at this location.

### Priority 2: Anti-Social Behaviour

- **You Said:** We have received concerns from retailers and security at the Beaumont Leys Shopping Centre that there is still a significant problem with anti-social behaviour caused by youths.
- **Our Action:** The Problem Management Plan has been successful so far. The beat team and the Safer Streets Team, have conducted high-visibility patrols of the Beaumont Leys Shopping Centre. Officers engaged positively with a number of local youths and store staff, reinforcing community relationships and promoting a safe and welcoming environment.

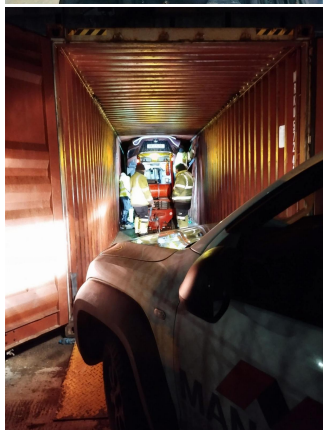
### Priority 3: Heathley Park

- **You Said:** Residents are concerned over an increase in anti-social behaviour, residential burglaries and theft from motor vehicles in the area of Heathley Park.
- **Our Action:** The beat team has continued to carry out regular high-visibility patrols across the area. These proactive efforts are aimed at maintaining community reassurance and deterring criminal activity.

- PC Holly made a visit to a known problem address where people were removed as the tenant wasn't present.
