What we are doing

In the last two months, officers have uncovered two properties on St James Road utilized for cannabis cultivation. Your local officers have diligently attended these locations to conduct searches for suspects, confiscate evidence, and restore the properties to a suitable condition for handover to the landlords. Concurrently, ongoing investigations are underway to ascertain the identities of those involved, facilitating their subsequent arrest and interview processes.

We extend our gratitude to the community for their continued support in providing essential information to your local law enforcement team. Your cooperation is invaluable in helping us apprehend offenders and uphold justice. Without your input, it becomes challenging for us to effectively monitor and enforce law and order in your neighborhoods. Your vigilance and willingness to share information play a crucial role in keeping our streets safe.

We are currently dealing with a range of ASB investigations on St James Rd, St James Terrace, and Abingdon Road. Patrols are in place and efforts are ongoing to minimise issues for residents. A Closure Order is still in place on Cedar Road and the landlord has been to court to seek a Possession Order which has brought more peace to the street.

Holy month of Ramadan

In April, as Ramadan concluded and Eid celebrations took place on April 10th, local residents came together to enjoy the festivities. After a challenging start with a stabbing on Sawley Street, we were in the right place at the right time and continued a strong presence in the area. Fortunately, the celebrations proceeded smoothly, with minimal requirements for intervention from the local police team on Evington Road and surrounding areas. Traffic flow was improved, and we tried hard to educate as well as enforce. We've received positive feedback from residents, mosques, and businesses, noting an evident increase in police presence and support from parking wardens throughout the local community. I am informed that Traffic Enforcement issued 225 tickets along Evington Road alone, aside from the side streets (but the majority of this was earlier in the month) with priorities being unsafe parking.

As your dedicated local beat team, we extend our gratitude to everyone who participated in the celebrations while remaining considerate of their neighbours. While we acknowledge the success of the month, we recognise that there's always room for improvement. Therefore, a debrief meeting was held with local Councillors and LCC partners to reflect on what worked well and identify areas for enhancement in preparation for next year's celebrations.
