You Said: Road Safety - results from "my views" survey conducted by the local team, via Neighbourhood Link, indicate that this is a priority concern on the area.
We Did: Proactive traffic operations have been conducted in the area in the interest of road safety.

Beat officers have been providing patrols at local schools at key times to improve the safety of pupils, parents and road users.



The highest threats to the NE11 Rushey Mead beat are identified as monthly NPA priorities. These are identified during; the Weekly Tasking Meeting, Neighbourhood Link Surveys, virtual and physical consultations with communities. Officers and staff actively prioritise their workloads with specific focus on the identified priorities.

The priorities are published both internally and externally via the Single Online Police.uk website, social media and in the publication of Beat Newsletters.

The ongoing priorities for NE11 Rushey Mead beat are:

- Work in collaboration with our communities and partners to tackle road safety related issues.
- In collaboration with communities and partners work to tackle hate crime, increase reporting, and to build trust and confidence in Leicestershire Police.
- In collaboration with Leicester City Council, and other partners to reduce Anti-Social Behaviour on our green spaces, on the Rushey Fields associated with cricket and alcohol.
- In collaboration with our partners and the community to tackle and reduce burglaries.

We loved every moment of it and will continue to engage with you to make sure our neighbourhood is a vibrant and safe place to live.
